8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a		
9	homeless bill of rights and prohibit discrimination against people without		
10	homes.		
11 12	An act relating to establishing a homeless bill of rights and prohibiting discrimination against people without homes		
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:		
14	Sec. 1. FINDINGS		
15	The Vermont General Assembly finds that:		
16	(1) At the present time, many persons have been rendered homeless as a		
17	result of economic hardship and a shortage of safe and affordable housing.		
18	(2) Article 1 of Chapter I of the Vermont Constitution states that		
19	Vermonters are "equally free and independent" and Article 7 of Chapter I		
20	states that all Vermonters are entitled to the same benefits and protections. As		

1	a result, a person should not be subject to discrimination based on his or her
2	housing status or being homeless.
3	(3) It is the intent of this act to help mitigate both the discrimination
4	people without homes face and the adverse effects individuals and
5	communities suffer when a person lacks a home.

7	§ 274. HOMELESS BILL OF RIGHTS
8	(a) A person's rights, privileges, or access to public services may not be
9	denied or abridged solely because he or she is without housing or because of
10	housing status. Such a person shall be granted the same rights and privileges
11	as any other resident of this State.
12	(b) A person without housing shall have the right:
13	(1) To use and move freely in public spaces, including public sidewalks
14	parks, transportation, and buildings, in the same manner as any other person
15	and without discrimination on the basis of his or her housing status.
16	(2) To equal treatment by all State and municipal agencies without
17	discrimination on the basis of housing status or homelessness.
18	(3) Not to face discrimination while seeking or maintaining
19	employment, due to his or her lack of a permanent mailing address or his or
20	her mailing address being that of a shelter or social service provider.

1	(4) To emergency medical care free from discrimination based on his or
2	her housing status or homelessness.
3	(5) To vote, register to vote, and receive documentation necessary to
4	prove identity for voting, without discrimination due to his or her housing
5	status or homelessness.
6	(6) To confidentiality of personal records and information in accordance
7	with all limitations on disclosure established by State and federal law,
8	including the Federal Homeless Management Information Systems, the Federal
9	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, and the Federal Violence
10	Against Women Act. In particular, victims of domestic and sexual violence
11	and stalking who are homeless have the right to safety and confidentiality. No
12	identifying information pertaining to such victims shall be released without a
13	written release unless the disclosure of the information is required by State or
14	federal law or a court order.
15	(7) To a reasonable expectation of privacy in his or her personal
16	property.
17	(8) To immediate and continued enrollment of his or her school-age
18	children based on the best interests of the child as provided for in 16 V.S.A.
19	§ 1075(e) and the McKinney-Vento Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 11431–11435.

1	(c) No person shall be subject to civil or criminal sanctions for soliciting,
2	sharing, accepting, or offering food, water, money, or other donations in public
3	places.
4	(d) No law shall target persons without housing or the harmless activities
5	associated with homelessness, or the provision of supports or services to
6	persons without housing or perceived to be without housing in traditional
7	public fora.
8	(e) A person aggrieved by a violation of this section may bring an action in
9	Superior Court for appropriate relief, including injunctive relief and actual
10	damages sustained as a result of the violation, costs, and reasonable
11	attorney's fees.

- (3) To make, print, or publish, or cause to be made, printed, or published any notice, statement, or advertisement, with respect to the sale or rental of a dwelling or other real estate, that indicates any preference, limitation, or discrimination based on race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, marital status, religious creed, color, national origin, housing status, or disability of a person, or because a person intends to occupy a dwelling with one or more minor children, or because a person is a recipient of public assistance.
- (4) To represent to any person because of the race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, marital status, religious creed, color, national origin, <u>housing status</u>, or disability of a person, or because a person intends to occupy a dwelling with one or more minor children, or because a person is a recipient of public assistance, that any dwelling or other real estate is not available for inspection, sale, or rental when the dwelling or real estate is in fact so available.

(7) To engage in blockbusting practices, for profit, which may include inducing or attempting to induce a person to sell or rent a dwelling by representations regarding the entry into the neighborhood of a person or persons of a particular race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, marital status, religious creed, color, national origin, housing status, or disability of a person, or because a person intends to occupy a dwelling with one or more minor children, or because a person is a recipient of public assistance.

(8) To deny any person access to or membership or participation in any multiple listing service, real estate brokers' organization, or other service, organization, or facility relating to the business of selling or renting dwellings, or to discriminate against any person in the terms or conditions of such access, membership, or participation, on account of race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, marital status, religious creed, color, national origin, housing status, or disability of a person, or because a person is a recipient of public assistance.

## 2 § 495. UNLAWFUL EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE

- (a) It shall be unlawful employment practice, except where a bona fide occupational qualification requires persons of a particular race, color, religion, national origin, <u>housing status</u>, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, ancestry, place of birth, age, crime victim status, or physical or mental condition:
- (1) For any employer, employment agency, or labor organization to discriminate against any individual because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, place of birth, <u>housing status</u>, crime victim status, or age or against a qualified individual with a disability;
- (2) For any person seeking employees or for any employment agency or labor organization to cause to be printed, published, or circulated any notice or advertisement relating to employment or membership indicating any preference, limitation, specification, or discrimination based upon race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, place of birth, <u>housing status</u>, crime victim status, age, or disability;
- (3) For any employment agency to fail or refuse to classify properly or refer for employment or to otherwise discriminate against any individual because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, sexual

1	orientation, gender identity, place of birth, housing status, crime victim status,
2	or age or against a qualified individual with a disability;
3	(4) For any labor organization, because of race, color, religion, ancestry,
4	national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, place of birth, <u>housing</u>
5	status, crime victim status, or age to discriminate against any individual or
6	against a qualified individual with a disability or to limit, segregate, or qualify
