12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. CHARTER AMENDMENT APPROVAL
14	The General Assembly approves the amendments to the charter of the City
15	of Barre as set forth in this act. Proposals of amendment were approved by the
16	voters on May 8, 2012.
17	Sec. 2. 24 App. V.S.A. chapter 1 is amended to read:
18	CHAPTER 1. CITY OF BARRE
19	Subchapter 1. Powers of The City Incorporation and General Provisions

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1	§ 110. FISCAL YEAR
2	The fiscal year of the City and the City School District shall begin on the
3	first day of July and end on the last day of June of each calendar year. The
4	fiscal year shall constitute the budget and accounting year as used in this
5	charter.
6	§ 111. BONDING OF CITY OFFICIALS
7	The Mayor, councilors, members of the Police Department, City Manager,
8	First Constable, Superintendent of Public Works, Tax Collector, and Clerk and
9	Treasurer shall annually be bonded by the City for the faithful discharge of
10	their respective duties, as provided by state statute, and the expense of said
11	bonds to be paid by the City.
12	§ 112. AMENDMENT OF CHARTER
13	This charter may be amended in the manner provided for by the laws of the
14	State of Vermont for amendment of municipal charters.
15	Subchapter 2. Elections and City Meetings
16	* * *
17	§ 204. POLLING PLACES
18	All annual and special elections and meetings shall be held at a central
19	polling place in the eity City to be designated by the eouncil Council and
20	which location is to be set forth in the warning. The conduct of said elections

1	and meetings shall conform where applicable to requirements as set forth in
2	Chapter 55, Subchapter 2 of Title 17, V.S.A. 17 V.S.A. §§ 2640-2667.
3	§ 205. OFFICERS ELECTED
4	(a) The legal voters shall elect biennially a mayor, a city clerk and
5	treasurer, and a first constable, and one person to serve as clerk and treasurer.
6	Annually, the legal voters of each ward shall elect from among the legal voters
7	of their respective wards, one alderman councilor for a term of two (2) years.
8	Annually, the legal voters shall elect three school commissioners to serve for a
9	term of three years.
10	(b) The legal voters shall elect annually Spaulding Union High School
11	District School Board members in the manner, number, and term limit as is
12	specified in the Barre City/Barre Town Union High School Agreement, dated
13	November 30, 1986, or any such successor document.
14	§ 206. VACANCIES
15	(a) In case of vacancy of any elected municipal city officer, except an
16	alderman a councilor or school commissioner, occasioned by death, removal
17	from the city City, resignation, or inability to serve, such vacancy, unless
18	herein otherwise provided, shall be filled by appointment by the city council
19	City Council until the next annual election. In such case, nomination may be
20	made by any member for the eouncil Council.

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1	(b) In case of a vacancy of any alderman councilor, occasioned by death,
2	removal from the ward, resignation, or inability to serve, such vacancy, unless
3	herein otherwise provided, shall be filled by election at a caucus of the legal
4	voters of the ward in which the vacancy occurs, duly warned, until the next
5	annual election. In such case, nomination may be made by any legal voter
6	from the ward in which the vacancy occurs.
7	(c) In case of a vacancy of any school commissioner, occasioned by death,
8	removal from the City, resignation, or inability to serve, such vacancy, unless
9	herein otherwise provided, shall be filled by appointment by the remaining
10	members of the School Board until the next annual election. In such case,
11	nomination may be made by any member of the School Board.
12	§ 207. VOTING ON REQUEST OF THE CITY MANAGER
13	* * *
14	(b) If, at the annual March meeting, the voters disapprove the request of the
15	eity manager, the mayor City Manager, the Mayor, or in his or her absence or
16	disability, the eity clerk City Clerk shall warn a general meeting of the legal
17	voters to consider the article disapproved by the voters, and to authorize a

9	Subchapter 3. City Council
10	§ 301. GOVERNING BODY
11	The city City shall be governed by an elected council and by an appointed
12	city manager and by such other officers and employees as may be duly
13	appointed pursuant to this charter, city ordinances or general laws of the State
14	of Vermont.
15	(1) The eity council City Council shall consist of the mayor Mayor and
16	two (2) aldermen councilors for each ward who shall serve for a term of two
17	(2) years.

19	(4) All city employees, to include full-time and part-time, are prohibited
20	from holding the office of alderman councilor or mayor.

Special meetings of the eity council City Council may be called at any time
by the mayor Mayor. They may also be called by the elerk Clerk on a petition
signed by a majority of the eity council City Council and filed with the elerk
<u>Clerk</u> . Notice of special meetings shall be served on the <u>mayor Mayor</u> and
aldermen councilors by the elerk Clerk delivering to each member a copy of
the call, or leaving it at the place of the member's residence. A majority of the
eity council City Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
business, but a smaller number may adjourn from time to time and may compel
the attendance of absent members in such manner as may be prescribed by
ordinance.

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§ 315. COMPENSATION OF CITY OFFICIALS

Compensation of mayor Mayor, alderman councilors, and other appointees and city officers:

(a) The mayor Mayor and aldermen councilors shall receive compensation in an amount as may be voted by the voters of the eity City at a meeting duly warned for said purpose.

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Subchapter 4. City Officials

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§ 407. APPOINTMENTS

(a) Any provision of general law conferring the appointing power or other power upon the mayor Mayor, the mayor Mayor and board of aldermen Board of Councilors City Council, the selectmen selectboard City Council, or other executive heads of a municipality, shall be construed as meaning the city manager City Manager and the appointments or power exercised by the city manager City Manager, in accordance with such provision, shall be given the same force and effect as if executed by the official named therein, except as herein otherwise provided.

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Subchapter 6. Taxation

§ 601. PAYMENT OF TAXES

(a) Taxes on real and personal property shall be paid in four (4) equal payments, with one-fourth of the annual tax bill for each taxpayer due and payable on August 15, November 15, February 15, and May 15 of each year to the city treasurer City Treasurer, unless otherwise changed by the city council City Council. At the close of the fiscal year any unexpended funds of the city budget and school budget must be used in the subsequent budget to cut the tax rate.

1	(b) At the close of the fiscal year, any unexpended funds remaining from
2	the city budget may be retained if approved by vote of the City Council, as an
3	undesignated fund balance for future use. Any funds retained pursuant to this
4	provision shall be limited to an amount not greater than five percent of the city
5	budget. Any amount remaining in excess of five percent in the city budget
6	must be used in the subsequent budget to cut the tax rate.

8	Subchapter 7. General Provisions
9	§ 701. FISCAL YEAR
10	(a) The fiscal year of the city and the city school district shall begin on the
11	first day of July and end on the last day of June of each calendar year. The
12	fiscal year shall constitute the budget and accounting year as used in this
13	charter. [Repealed.]
14	§ 702. BONDING OF CITY OFFICIALS
15	The mayor, councilors, members of the police department, city manager,
16	first constable, superintendent of public works, tax collector, and clerk and
17	treasurer shall annually be bonded by the city for the faithful discharge of their
18	respective duties, as provided by state statute, and the expense of said bonds to
19	be paid by the city. [Repealed.]

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§ 703. AMENDMENT OF CHARTER

State of Vermont for amendment of municipal charters. [Repeal	led.]
