6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to assess and improve the delivery of
7	services to incarcerated individuals with a serious functional impairment and
8	collect information regarding individuals with a mental illness or disorder.
9	An act relating to the mental health needs of the corrections population
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. INDIVIDUALS WITH A SERIOUS FUNCTIONAL IMPAIRMENT
12	INCARCERATED IN A CORRECTIONAL FACILITY
13	(a) On or before April 1, 2012, the secretary of human services shall
14	establish a work group, including representatives appointed by the secretary of
15	human services from the departments of corrections, of mental health, and of
16	disabilities, aging, and independent living and including stakeholders, for the
17	purpose of identifying and assessing the needs of individuals with a serious
18	functional impairment as defined in 28 V.S.A. § 906(1) who are incarcerated in
19	a correctional facility. The work group shall:

1	(1) identify all individuals with a serious functional impairment and
2	match each individual with the appropriate programs and services while the
3	individual is incarcerated in a correctional facility;
4	(2) discuss with the judiciary alternatives to initial incarceration and
5	ways to limit the length of incarceration for an individual with a serious
6	functional impairment, as appropriate;
7	(3) work toward the successful reintegration into the community of an
8	individual with serious functional impairment who has been incarcerated in a
9	correctional facility;
10	(4) work toward reducing the recidivism rate among individuals with a
11	serious functional impairment; and
12	(5) make long-term, systemic policy recommendations to the secretary
13	of human services to create or improve mechanisms, programs, and services
14	that benefit individuals with a serious functional impairment incarcerated in a
15	correctional facility.
16	(b) On or before January 15, 2013, the secretary of human services shall
17	issue a report to the general assembly recommending how to better address the
18	needs of individuals with a serious functional impairment who are incarcerated
19	in a correctional facility, based on the findings of the work group in the course
20	of its duties as described in subsection (a) of this section. Prior to finalizing
21	the report, the secretary shall obtain public input regarding the report and shall

1	release a draft report to the public for public comment on or before
2	December 15, 2012. At minimum, the report shall address the following:
3	(1) the prevalence of serious functional impairment among those
4	members of the corrections population incarcerated in a correctional facility at
5	the time the report is issued;
6	(2) the rate of recidivism among individuals with a serious functional
7	impairment;
8	(3) the prevalence of psychotropic medication utilization in the
9	corrections population, including data relating to the number of incarcerated
10	individuals with a serious functional impairment with valid prescriptions for
11	psychotropic medications;
12	(4) the number of individuals incarcerated in a correctional facility with
13	a serious functional impairment who are in need of mental health services that
14	are not currently available to them; and
15	(5) whether there are opportunities to combine the department of mental
16	health's expertise with that of the department of corrections to improve the
17	mental health services for individuals with a serious functional impairment
18	who are incarcerated in a correctional facility.
19	Sec. 2. INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS AND MENTAL HEALTH
20	As a complement to the assessment conducted pursuant to Sec. 1 of this act,
21	the commissioner of mental health shall ensure that information regarding

1	incarcerated individuals with a mental illness or disorder as defined in
2	28 V.S.A. § 906(3) is collected and recorded separately, in addition to the other
3	requirements of this act. The information collected shall include recidivism
4	rates among this population. On or before January 15, 2013, the commissioner
5	shall report this information and make recommendations to the house
6	committee on corrections and institutions, the house committee on human
7	services, the senate committee on health and welfare, and the senate committee
8	on judiciary.
9	Sec. 3. TRAINING
10	On or before October 15, 2012, the departments of mental health, of
11	disabilities, aging, and independent living, and of corrections, with input and
12	participation from peer and advocacy organizations, shall review the
13	department of corrections' training program for correctional officers as it
14	relates to the Americans with Disabilities Act and to working with individuals
15	with a serious functional impairment or a mental illness or disorder. No later
16	than January 15, 2013, the commissioners of mental health and of corrections
17	shall submit a report to the general assembly identifying the strengths,
18	weaknesses, and opportunities for improvement in this training.
19	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on passage.
