| 8 | It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont: |
| 9 | Sec. 1. COVID-19 MANUFACTURING GRANT PROGRAM |
| 10 | (a) Purpose. |
| 11 | (1) The purpose of this section is to establish a COVID-19 |
| 12 | Manufacturing Grant Program to assist Vermont manufacturing companies |
| 13 | in quickly accelerating production of items necessary to respond to the |
| 14 | COVID-19 outbreak. |
| 15 | (2) The Program shall provide grants to manufacturers to increase |
| 16 | capacity in current operations and to pivot production to build and assemble |
| 17 | critical need items, including: |
| 18 | (A) personal protection equipment, including N95 respirators, |
| 19 | surgical masks, cloth masks, and isolation gowns; |
| 20 | (B) respiratory care equipment, including ventilators; |

| 2 | (D) other items identified by the State Emergency Operations Center |
| 3 | as necessary for workplace and community safety. |
| 4 | (b) Eligible recipients. To be eligible for a grant, an applicant shall meet |
| 5 | the following criteria: |
| 6 | (1) the applicant has demonstrated manufacturing capacity; |
| 7 | (2) the facility where the applicant manufactures qualifying products is |
| 8 | located in Vermont; and |
| 9 | (3) the applicant has 500 or fewer employees or otherwise meets a Small |
| 10 | Business Administration classification of small business or small |
| 11 | manufacturer. |
| 12 | (c) Eligible use of funds. A recipient may use grant funds for the |
| 13 | following: |
| 14 | (1) purchase and set up of production equipment; |
| 15 | (2) expenses necessary to produce critical care items; |
| 16 | (3) prototyping expenses for complex medical devices; and |
| 17 | (4) training expenses to train employees in the new production process |
| 18 | and equipment. |
| 19 | (d) Amount of grants. A grant shall be one-time and shall not exceed |
| 20 | \$20,000.00 per recipient. |
| 21 | (e) Administration of grants. |

| 7 | (1) The Agency shall report to the General Assembly bi-weekly during |
| 8 | the pandemic crisis on the number of grants awarded, the projected and actual |

| 11 | (2) The Agency shall submit a final report on the Grant program on or |
| 12 | before December 15, 2020. |
| 13 | (g) Funding. The Agency of Commerce and Community Development |
| 14 | may use not more than \$500,000.00 to award grants pursuant to this act using |
| 15 | funds appropriated to it for the New Remote Worker Grant Program created in |
