Whereas, her essays and poems are published in anthologies, journals, and magazines, and

Whereas, Alice Gilborn's own books include a memoir, recalling her mother, a poetry chapbook, and an essay collection, and

Whereas, as a Vermont resident, Alice Gilborn has designed and edited a two-volume anthology of selected Green Mountain State poets, and

Whereas, her professional memberships include the National League of American Pen Women and the Poetry Society of Vermont, now therefore be it
