<u>Whereas</u>, after many decades of successful hospitality entrepreneurship, Ursula Dalem sold the building to the Windham & Windsor Housing Trust, which in partnership with Groundworks Collaborative has converted the property into a much-needed affordable housing facility, now therefore be it
