13	(a) Vermont students shall, as a condition of being awarded a high school
14	diploma, take and receive a passing grade in a course in U.S. civics. The
15	curriculum for this course shall include:
16	(1) philosophical principles, including:
17	(A) unalienable rights;
18	(B) contract theory of government;
19	(C) popular sovereignty;
20	(D) republican principles; and

1	(E) democracy; and
2	(2) the U.S. Constitution, including:
3	(A) separation of powers and checks and balances;
4	(B) majority rule;
5	(C) minority rights and individual rights as articulated in the Bill of
6	Rights and the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution;
7	(D) federalism, including the Supremacy Clause (Article VI, Clause
8	2 of the U.S. Constitution), 10th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, and the
9	Necessary and Proper Clause (Article I, Section 8 of the U.S. Constitution);

11	(E) judicial review, including the doctrines of plain meaning, original
12	intent, and inference.
13	(b) This section shall apply to all students who are awarded a high school
14	diploma who attend a State public school or a career technical center, but shall
15	not apply to students who are in special education programs.
16	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2019 and shall apply to high school
18	students who graduate in or after the 2021 academic year.
