7	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to allow a humane officer who has
8	seized an abused animal to arrange necessary medical care for the animal.

10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 13 V.S.A. § 354 is amended to read:
12	§ 354. ENFORCEMENT; POSSESSION OF ABUSED ANIMAL;
13	SEARCHES AND SEIZURES; FORFEITURE

15	(c) A humane officer shall provide suitable care, including necessary
16	medical attention, at a reasonable cost for an animal seized under this section,
17	and have a lien on the animal for all expenses incurred. A humane officer may
18	arrange for the euthanasia of a severely injured, diseased, or suffering animal
19	upon the recommendation of a licensed veterinarian. A humane officer may

arrange for euthanasia of an animal seized under this section when the owner is

unwilling or unable to provide necessary medical attention required while the
animal is in custodial care or when the animal cannot be safely confined under
standard housing conditions. An animal not destroyed by euthanasia shall be
kept in custodial care until final disposition of the criminal charges except as
provided in subsections (d) through (h) of this section. The custodial caregiver
shall be responsible for maintaining the records applicable to all animals
seized, including identification, residence, location, medical treatment, and
disposition of the animals.
