6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to repeal the
7	limits on the issuance to nonresidents of permits to train dogs to pursue black
8	bear.
9	An act relating to a nonresident permit to train dogs to pursue black bear
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 5007 is amended to read:
12	§ 5007. HUNTING BLACK BEAR WITH DOGS
13	(a) No person shall pursue black bear with the aid of dogs, either for
14	training or taking purposes, without a permit issued by the commissioner
15	Commissioner. The number of permits issued to nonresidents in any given
16	year shall not exceed ten percent of the number of permits issued to residents
17	in the preceding year. The commissioner shall establish a process for

determining which nonresidents are to receive a permit if there are more

nonresident applicants than nonresident permits. A nonresident may train dogs

1	to hunt bear only while training season is in effect in the nonresident's home
2	state and subject to the laws and regulations of this state.

- 3 (b) Permits will be issued to residents for a fee of \$50.00.
- 4 (c) Application fees for nonresidents shall be \$10.00 with a permit fee of
- 5 \$200.00 for successful applicants Permits will be issued to nonresidents for a
- 6 <u>fee of \$200.00</u>.

- 8 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
