5	Subject: Conservation; water resources; water quality standards
6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to clarify the authority of the natural
7	resources board to adopt water management types in the Vermont water quality
8	standards. The bill would also clarify the natural resources board's authority to
9	adopt energy policy in the water quality standards. In addition, the bill
10	requires the natural resources board to submit to the general assembly for
11	review any proposed amendments to the water quality standards. The bill also
12	requires the agency of natural resources to update the 17 basin plans of the
13	state by December 31, 2010.
14	An act relating to the water quality standards of Vermont
15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
16	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 1252 is amended to read:
17	§ 1252. CLASSIFICATION OF WATERS; MIXING ZONES

(a) The state adopts, for the purposes of classifying its waters, the

following classes and definitions thereof:

Class A. (1) Suitable for publi	ic water supply	with disinfection	n when
necessary; cha	racter uniformly ex	cellent; or		

(2) High quality waters which have significant ecological value.

Class B. Suitable for bathing and recreation, irrigation and agricultural uses; good fish habitat; good aesthetic value; acceptable for public water supply with filtration and disinfection.

(e) The board shall adopt standards of water quality to achieve the purposes of the water classifications. Such standards shall be expressed in detailed water quality criteria, taking into account the available data and the effect of these criteria on existing activities, using as appropriate: (1) numerical values, (2) biological parameters; and (3) narrative descriptions. These standards shall establish limits for at least the following: alkalinity, ammonia, chlorine, fecal coliform, color, nitrates, oil and grease, dissolved oxygen, pH, phosphorus, temperature, all toxic substances for which the United States Environmental Protection Agency has established criteria values and any other water quality parameters deemed necessary by the board. These standards shall not adopt or amend energy policy of the state without a specific statutory mandate to do so.

(i) The board may adopt by rule water management types representing subcategories of water quality criteria for designated uses within the classes of

1	waters set forth in subsection (a) of this section to achieve and maintain a level
2	of quality that fully supports the attainable uses and water quality protection of
3	all or any portion of a water body. The designation or redesignation of a water
4	body as a water management type by the board shall be done by rule according
5	to chapter 25 of Title 3.
6	Sec. 2. 10 V.S.A. § 1253(d) is amended to read:
7	(d) The board shall determine what degree of water quality and
8	classification should be obtained and maintained for those waters not classified
9	by it before 1981 following the procedures in sections 1254 and 1258 of this
10	title. Those waters shall be classified in the public interest. The secretary shall
11	revise all 17 basin plans by January 1, 2006 December 31, 2010, and update
12	them every five years thereafter. On or before January 4 15 of each year, the
13	secretary shall report to the house committees on agriculture, natural resources
14	and energy, and on fish, wildlife and water resources, and to the senate
15	committees on agriculture and on natural resources and energy regarding the
16	progress made and difficulties encountered in revising basin plans. By
17	January 1, 1993, the secretary shall prepare an overall management plan to
18	ensure that the water quality standards are met in all state waters.
19	Sec. 3. LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
20	VERMONT WATER QUALITY STANDARDS

(a) The general assembly finds that:

1	(1) the current proposed amendments to the Vermont water quality
2	standards:
3	(A) are of a scope and breadth that may exceed the statutory authority
4	provided to the natural resources board to adopt water quality standards by
5	administrative rule; and
6	(B) may be in conflict with existing statutory policy of the state
7	regarding water quality and energy development; and
8	(2) the general assembly needs time to evaluate the proposed
9	amendments to the water quality standards before they are submitted to the
10	legislative committee on administrative rules.
11	(b) Prior to filing a proposed rule under section 838 of Title 3 to amend the
12	water quality standards, the natural resources board shall submit to the house
13	committee on fish, wildlife and water resources and the senate committee on
14	natural resources and energy the proposed amendments to the water quality
15	standards. The house committee on fish, wildlife and water resources and the
16	senate committee on natural resources and energy shall review the proposed
17	rule amending the water quality standards and shall recommend whether the
18	proposed rule should be amended or whether the proposed rule should be filed
19	with the secretary of state under section 838 of Title 3.
20	(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of 10 V.S.A. § 1252(e), which authorize

the natural resources board to adopt water quality standards, the water quality
