14	bail under section 7553 or 7553a of this title, shall at his or her appearance
15	before a judicial officer be ordered released pending trial in accordance with
16	this section.
17	(1) The person shall be ordered released on personal recognizance or
18	upon the execution of an unsecured appearance bond in an amount specified by
19	the judicial officer unless the judicial officer determines that such a release will

not reasonably assure the appearance of the person as required. In determining

whether the person presents a risk of nonappearance, the judicial officer shall consider, in addition to any other factors, the seriousness of the offense charged and the number of offenses with which the person is charged. If the officer determines that such a release will not reasonably assure the appearance of the person as required, the officer shall, either in lieu of or in addition to the above methods of release, impose the least restrictive of the following conditions or the least restrictive combination of the following conditions which will reasonably assure the appearance of the person as required:

(A) Place the person in the custody of a designated person or organization agreeing to supervise him or her <u>if the person is under 18 years</u> of age.

- (2) If the judicial officer determines that conditions of release imposed to assure appearance will not reasonably protect the public, the judicial officer may in addition impose the least restrictive of the following conditions or the least restrictive combination of the following conditions which will reasonably assure protection of the public:
- (A) Place the person in the custody of a designated person or organization agreeing to supervise him or her if the person is under 18 years of age.
