1 AN ACT Relating to the health professional loan repayment and 2 scholarship program fund; adding a new section to chapter 28B.115 3 RCW; and making appropriations.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28B.115 6 RCW to read as follows:

7 legislature finds that improved access to comprehensive The health care services is vital to achieve health equity and an 8 increased quality of healthy life for the people of Washington. Many 9 10 underserved communities facing financial barriers, including those 11 related to providers' health education loan debt and disparate salaries, struggle to attract and retain well-trained health 12 13 professionals. Health professional shortage areas also face additional health care delivery challenges, including patient income 14 or transportation barriers and lower provider service reimbursements. 15

16 The health professional loan repayment and scholarship program 17 fund assists underserved communities in recruiting and retaining 18 qualified health professionals. The incentive program also encourages 19 interested and academically prepared health care students and 20 professionals to consider practice in shortage areas. The legislature 21 finds that interested students who are encouraged to explore the benefits and unique professional challenges presented in rural health practice are more likely to establish community roots and remain in the area in which they are trained. Providing underserved communities additional resources to recruit qualified health professionals reinforces the state's commitment to improve access to comprehensive health care for all persons in Washington.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The sum of four million dollars, or as 8 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general 9 fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, for the purposes of 10 restoring funding to the health professional loan repayment and 11 scholarship program fund.

12 (2) The sum of four million dollars, or as much thereof as may be 13 necessary, is appropriated from the general fund for the fiscal year 14 ending June 30, 2017, for the purposes of restoring funding to the 15 health professional loan repayment and scholarship program fund.

16 (3) The amounts appropriated in this section shall be deposited 17 into the health professional loan repayment and scholarship program 18 fund.

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
