AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending 2012 2nd sp.s. c 2 ss 3002 and 5005 (uncodified); amending 2011 1st sp.s. c 49 ss 3052, 3112, and 5101 (uncodified); amending 2011 1st sp.s. c 48 s 3070 (uncodified); amending 2005 c 8 s 1 (uncodified); amending 2007 c 4 s 1 (uncodified); amending 2008 c 5 s 1 (uncodified); creating new sections; and declaring an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

- 9 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted and, 10 subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several dollar 11 amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall 12 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects during 13 the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 14 15 June 30, 2015, out of the several funds specified in this act.
 - (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 18 (a) "Fiscal year 2014" or "FY 2014" means the period beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014.

- 1 (b) "Fiscal year 2015" or "FY 2015" means the period beginning July 2 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015.
- 3 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an unappropriated status.
 - (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only for the specified purpose.
 - (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.
 - (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2015-2017 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for the project or program in the future.
 - (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining on June 30, 2013, from the 2011-2013 biennial appropriations for each project.

- (2)(a) Minor works projects are single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. These projects can generally be completed within two years of the appropriation with the funding provided. Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their minor works lists that are a phase of a larger project, and that if combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000, or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works projects.
