(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
 state council of firefighters.

(4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 5 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten 6 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) 7 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate 8 9 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service before ten years of service have been completed, the 10 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the 11 12 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, 13 14 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 15 16 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 17 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their 18 19 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be 20 21 surrendered upon conviction.

7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the 8 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from 9 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The 10 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, 11 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

12 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the 13 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this 14 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in this section and under contract between 15 subsection (2) of the 16 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the 17 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

18 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to 19 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the 20 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the 21 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety 22 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

(7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 35 RCW to read as follows:

36 "Washington wine license plates" means special license plates 37 issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a landscape of Washington's 38 wine regions.
