**SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1556**

1 AN ACT Relating to creating Imagine special license plates;  
2 reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and 46.68.420; and  
3 adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2016 c 36 s 1, 2016 c 30 s 1, 2016 c  
6 16 s 1, and 2016 c 15 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as  
7 follows:

8 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the  
9 department:

10 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized  
11 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license  
12 plates unless otherwise specified;

13 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the  
14 department;

15 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter  
16 46.87 RCW; and

17 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

18 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special  
19 license plates:

28 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters  
29 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility  
30 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington  
31 state council of firefighters.

32 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license  
33 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten  
34 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)  
35 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate  
36 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting  
37 service before ten years of service have been completed, the  
38 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the

1 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer  
 2 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,  
 3 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter  
 4 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will  
 5 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying  
 6 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates  
 7 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their  
 8 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a  
 9 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be  
 10 surrendered upon conviction.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c  
 12 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and  
 13 amended to read as follows:

14 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon  
 15 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the  
 16 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special  
 17 license plate fee as listed in this section.

6 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for  
7 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds  
8 must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the  
9 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to  
10 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including  
11 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being  
12 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer  
13 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2016 c 36 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 3, and 2016  
15 c 15 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

16 (1) The department shall:

17 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW  
18 46.17.220;

19 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial  
20 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and  
21 collection expenses incurred by it; and

22 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state  
23 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

24 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor  
25 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has  
26 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license  
27 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been  
28 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special  
29 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the  
30 following appropriate account as created in this section in the  
31 custody of the state treasurer:

1 Washington tennis Provide funds to cities to assist in  
2 the construction and maintenance  
3 of a public tennis facility with at  
4 least four indoor tennis courts. A  
5 city is eligible for construction  
6 funds if the city does not already  
7 have a public or private facility  
8 with at least four indoor tennis  
9 courts. Funds for construction  
10 must first be made available to the  
11 most populous eligible city,  
12 according to the most recent  
13 census, for a time period not to  
14 exceed five years after January 1,  
15 2017. After the five-year time  
16 period, the funds for construction  
17 must be made available to the  
18 next most populous eligible city.  
19 Funds for the maintenance of a  
20 public tennis facility with at least  
21 four indoor tennis courts must  
22 first be made available to the first  
23 eligible city that utilizes funds for  
24 construction provided by chapter  
25 16, Laws of 2016.
