**HOUSE BILL 1806**

1 AN ACT Relating to ensuring that commercial fishing revenue  
2 benefits communities most dependent on the industry; amending RCW  
3 82.27.070; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that commercial  
6 fishing is an important industry to Washington, and particularly to  
7 the rural, coastal communities of southwest Washington. Upon landing  
8 certain species of fish and shellfish, commercial fishers are subject  
9 to the enhanced food fish excise tax, also known as the "landing  
10 tax." Because the tax is paid to the state, it does not directly  
11 support the communities on which the industry depends. In order to  
12 serve the families residing in these communities, many of whom are  
13 active participants in the commercial fishing industry,  
14 municipalities need the resources to provide adequate public safety  
15 services and transportation infrastructure. The legislature intends  
16 to direct a portion of landing tax revenue to the communities that  
17 host this important industry and ensure that they directly benefit  
18 from the taxes paid by commercial fishers landing fish within their  
19 jurisdiction.

1       **Sec. 2.** RCW 82.27.070 and 2020 c 148 s 28 are each amended to  
2 read as follows:

3       All taxes collected by the department of revenue under this  
4 chapter shall be deposited in the state general fund except for the  
5 following:

6       (1) The equivalent of 50 percent of the excise tax collected must  
7 be distributed to the city in which the fish was landed;

8       (2) The excise tax on anadromous game fish is deposited in the  
9 fish, wildlife, and conservation account created in RCW 77.12.170(3)  
10 ((-

11 ~~2-))~~, except for the equivalent of 50 percent of the tax  
12 collected, which must be distributed to the city in which the fish  
13 was landed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section; and

14       (3) The excise tax on ocean waters, Columbia river, Willapa Bay,  
15 and Grays Harbor chinook, coho, and chum salmon is deposited as  
16 follows:

17       (a) The equivalent of ~~((five and twenty-five one-hundredths))~~  
18 2.65 percent shall be deposited in the state general fund~~((-))~~;

19       (b) The equivalent of one percent shall be deposited in the fish,  
20 wildlife, and conservation account created in RCW 77.12.170(3); and

21       (c) The equivalent of 2.625 percent must be distributed to the  
22 city in which the fish was landed, pursuant to subsection (1) of this  
23 section.
