- 1 AN ACT Relating to smoke detection devices; and amending RCW
- 2 43.44.110.

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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.44.110 and 1995 c 369 s 34 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Smoke detection devices shall be installed inside all dwelling units:
- 8 (a) Occupied by persons other than the owner on and after December 9 31, 1981; or
 - (b) Built or manufactured in this state after December 31, 1980.
- 11 (2) The smoke detection devices shall be designed, manufactured, 12 and installed inside dwelling units in conformance with:
 - (a) Nationally accepted standards; and
- 14 (b) As provided by the administrative procedure act, chapter 34.05 15 RCW, rules and regulations promulgated by the chief of the Washington
- 16 state patrol, through the director of fire protection.
- 17 (3) Installation of smoke detection devices shall be the
- 18 responsibility of the owner. Maintenance of smoke detection devices,
- 19 including the replacement of batteries where required for the proper

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- operation of the smoke detection device, shall be the responsibility of the tenant, who shall maintain the device as specified by the manufacturer. At the time of a vacancy, the owner shall insure that the smoke detection device is operational prior to the reoccupancy of the dwelling unit.
 - (4) Any owner or tenant failing to comply with this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars.
 - (5) After January 1, 2014, when installing a new smoke detection device or replacing an existing smoke detection device, an owner or tenant must install a tamper-resistant, ten-year lithium battery smoke detection device. A landlord is not required to install a tamper-resistant, ten-year lithium battery smoke detection device as required by this subsection if:
- 14 <u>(a) The dwelling unit is equipped with a hardwired smoke detection</u>
 15 <u>device with a battery backup; or</u>
- 16 <u>(b) The dwelling unit is equipped with a smoke detection device</u> 17 <u>combined with a carbon monoxide alarm.</u>
 - (6) For the purposes of this section:

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- (a) "Dwelling unit" means a single unit providing complete, independent living facilities for one or more persons including permanent provisions for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation; and
- (b) "Smoke detection device" means an assembly incorporating in one unit a device which detects visible or invisible particles of combustion, the control equipment, and the alarm-sounding device, operated from a power supply either in the unit or obtained at the point of installation.

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
