1 AN ACT Relating to mosquito control districts; and amending RCW
2 17.28.160.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 17.28.160 and 1981 c 156 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 A mosquito control district organized under this chapter may:

7 (1) Take all necessary or proper steps for the extermination of
8 mosquitoes.

9 (2) Subject to the paramount control of the county or city in which
10 they exist, abate as nuisances all stagnant pools of water and other
11 breeding places for mosquitoes.

12 (3) If necessary or proper, in the furtherance of the objects of
13 this chapter, build, construct, repair, and maintain necessary dikes,
14 levees, cuts, canals, or ditches upon any land, and acquire by
15 purchase, condemnation, or by other lawful means, in the name of the
16 district, any lands, rights-of-way, easements, property, or material
17 necessary for any of those purposes.

18 (4) Make contracts to indemnify or compensate any owner of land or

1 other property for any injury or damage necessarily caused by the use
2 or taking of property for dikes, levees, cuts, canals, or ditches.

3 (5)(a) Enter upon without hindrance any lands within the district
4 and adjacent thereto for the purpose of inspection to ascertain whether
5 breeding places of mosquitoes exist upon such lands; or to abate public
6 nuisances in accordance with this chapter; or to ascertain if notices
7 to abate the breeding of mosquitoes upon such lands have been complied
8 with; or to treat (~~with oil or other larvicidal material any breeding~~
9 ~~places of mosquitoes~~) using integrated pest management, as defined in
10 RCW 17.15.010, methods in places where mosquitoes are found or are
11 likely to exist upon such lands.

12 (b) For land adjacent to land within the district, a district must
13 give prior written notice to the property owner of the district's
14 intent to enter upon the land for the purposes specified in (a) of this
15 subsection.

16 (6) Sell or lease any land, rights-of-way, easements, property or
17 material acquired by the district.

18 (7) Issue warrants payable at the time stated therein to evidence
19 the obligation to repay money borrowed or any other obligation incurred
20 by the district, warrants so issued to draw interest at a rate fixed by
21 the board payable annually or semiannually as the board may prescribe.

22 (8) Make contracts with the United States, or any state,
23 municipality, or any department of those entities for carrying out the
24 general purpose for which the district is formed.

25 (9) Acquire by gift, devise, bequest, lease, or purchase, real and
26 personal property necessary or convenient for its purposes.

27 (10) Make contracts, employ engineers, health officers,
28 sanitarians, physicians, laboratory personnel, attorneys, and other
29 technical or professional assistants; and publish information or
30 literature and do any and all other things necessary or incident to the
31 powers granted by, and to carry out the projects specified in this
32 chapter.

33 (11) Subject to management considerations identified during
34 consultation with the landowner, cut or remove shrubbery or undergrowth
35 as necessary or proper in order to carry out this chapter.
