1 AN ACT Relating to creating a school-based influenza vaccination
2 pilot program; creating a new section; and providing an expiration
3 date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The department of health and the office
6 of the superintendent of public instruction shall jointly establish a
7 school-based influenza vaccination pilot program using both killed
8 vaccine and live attenuated vaccine in one urban school district and
9 one rural school district.

10 (2) The department of health shall convene a working group to plan
11 the school-based influenza vaccination pilot program established under
12 this section. The working group shall include representatives of:

13 (a) The Washington state chapter of the American academy of
14 pediatrics;

15 (b) The Washington academy of family physicians;

16 (c) Each school district in which the pilot program operates;

17 (d) The office of the superintendent of public instruction; and

18 (e) The state medicaid medical director.

1 (3) Not later than January 1, 2011, the department of health and
2 the office of the superintendent of public instruction shall submit to
3 the governor, and the appropriate committees of the senate and house of
4 representatives a jointly written report containing the results and the
5 recommendations of the department and the office to continue, expand,
6 or terminate the school-based influenza vaccination pilot program.

7 (4) The department of health and the office of the superintendent
8 of public instruction may seek, receive, and spend money received
9 through an appropriation, grant, donation, or reimbursement from any
10 public or private source to implement the school-based influenza
11 vaccination pilot program.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act expires July 1, 2011.
