## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5657

AN ACT Relating to creating a pilot program to encourage school districts to extend the school day to provide homework assistance to middle schools; creating new sections; making appropriations; and providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that expanded 7 learning opportunities models provide academic and other learning supports to students outside of regular operating school-day hours 8 and often supplement in-school learning. The legislature finds that 9 providing an additional hour at the end of each school day for middle 10 11 school students to work on homework assignments with a teacher 12 available to answer questions can provide helpful academic assistance 13 to students that will result in a reduction in the student dropout 14 The legislature further finds that this can be done by rate. cadre of teachers who 15 providing a take turns providing this 16 assistance to the students. The legislature intends to create a pilot 17 program to encourage school districts to use state investments to 18 school day extend the at middle schools to provide homework assistance to students. 19

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1)(a) Subject to funds provided for this specific purpose, a pilot program is established to encourage school 2 districts to provide middle school students expanded learning 3 opportunities by extending the school day one hour beyond the regular 4 school day of the school district during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 5 6 school years for the purpose of providing homework assistance to 7 students. Funding shall be provided for the 2015-16 and the 2016-17 8 school years;

9 (b) The funding must be used to provide a cadre of teachers who 10 take turns providing homework assistance to students at the end of 11 the regular school day. Teachers providing instruction during the 12 extended-day time shall be paid at an hourly rate using a 13 supplemental contract as authorized under RCW 28A.400.200(4); and

14 (c) Funding received under this section may also be used for 15 transportation to and from school for students participating in the 16 extended school day.

17 (2) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall 18 create a competitive grant process to award the funding provided 19 under this section.

(3) In accordance with RCW 28A.630.124, the expanded learning opportunities council shall monitor the progress of the pilot program created by this section, oversee an evaluation of the effectiveness of the program in improving student academic progress, and report to the governor and the legislature in its 2017 annual report.

25 (4) This section expires July 1, 2018.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. The sum of two hundred fifty thousand 27 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for 28 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, from the general fund to the 29 office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes 30 of this act.

31 (2) The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars, or as much 32 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year 33 ending June 30, 2017, from the general fund to the office of the 34 superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act.
