- 1 WHEREAS, The Order of the Sons of Italy in America (OSIA) is the 2 largest and oldest national organization for men and women of Italian
- 3 heritage in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, The organization started in 1905 as a mutual aid society for early Italian immigrants; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Women have always shared equal rights with men in the
- $\,7\,$ Order of the Sons of Italy and have held leadership positions at all
- 8 levels including national president and vice president; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Sons of Italy Foundation has given more than \$164
- 10 million to scholarships, medical research, disaster relief, and other
- 11 causes; and
- 12 WHEREAS, OSIA includes an anti-defamation arm called the
- 13 Commission for Social Justice that is committed to fighting racism,
- 14 prejudice, and the stereotyping of all races, religions, and
- 15 cultures; and
- 16 WHEREAS, OSIA's mission includes encouraging the study of the
- 17 Italian language and culture in American schools and universities;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, OSIA is dedicated to preserving Italian American
- 20 traditions, culture, history, and heritage; and
- 21 WHEREAS, OSIA promotes closer cultural relations between the
- 22 United States and Italy; and

- 1 WHEREAS, OSIA has hundreds of thousands of family members 2 located in all fifty states and the District of Columbia; and
- WHEREAS, In its early years OSIA established free schools to teach immigrants English and aid them in becoming U.S. citizens; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The first OSIA lodges established orphanages and 7 homes for the elderly, welfare societies, and credit unions to 8 aid members in need; and
- 9 WHEREAS, During the world wars OSIA members bought war bonds 10 and war stamps and held competitions between lodges to 11 contribute the most money to the Red Cross; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Every president since Woodrow Wilson has publicly 13 acknowledged the contributions of OSIA; and
- WHEREAS, An estimated 28,000 OSIA members served in the U.S. armed forces during World War I; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In 1947 OSIA launched a letter-writing campaign 17 urging members' relatives in Italy to support pro-democracy 18 candidates in the first democratic election in Italy's history; 19 and
- 20 WHEREAS, The Order began to lobby Congress to make Columbus 21 Day a federal holiday in 1932 and was successful in that effort 22 under President Johnson in 1968; and
- WHEREAS, OSIA claimed in its membership veterans like Anthony Casamento, recipient of the Medal of Honor; and
- 25 WHEREAS, OSIA archives at the University of Minnesota's 26 Immigration History Research Center create the largest 27 collection of Italian American resource materials in the United 28 States and comprise more than 1,200 linear feet; and
- WHEREAS, Italian Americans have made major contributions to American art, culture, and cuisine; and
- 31 WHEREAS, The Order of the Sons of Italy established its 32 first northwest lodge in 1923 in Pierce County in Tacoma, 33 Washington; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Since then the Sons of Italy have spread across the 35 state with lodges established in eighteen Washington cities from 36 Tacoma to the Tri-Cities, Black Diamond to Bellevue, and from 37 Aberdeen to Yakima;
