Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Senate Bill 354 requires driver education courses offered by school districts, technical colleges, and licensed private driver schools to provide instruction in the hazards posed by other motor vehicles to school buses and passengers loading onto or unloading from school buses and with the provisions of the statutes requiring motorists to stop when a school bus is displaying flashing lights.

In 2022, two of Wisconsin's 16 technical colleges enrolled students in Driver Education courses. These colleges will incur increased costs to update curriculum and instructional materials. If additional colleges enroll students in Driver Education courses, those colleges will similarly incur increased cost to update curriculum and instructional materials. The costs of these updates are unknown, but are estimated to be minimal.
