## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill provides that the court is only required to sustain an objection to the use of videoconferencing technology that is made by a defendant, but not by a respondent, regarding a proceeding the defendant is entitled to attend in person.

Under the bill, the court may exercise its discretion in determining any objection by a respondent to the use of videoconferencing technology regarding any proceeding, even if the respondent is entitled to attend the proceeding in person.

The Director of State Courts has determined that this bill has no fiscal impact on the Courts.
