2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 1076

March 7, 2022 - Introduced by Representatives STEFFEN, BEHNKE, BRANDTJEN, CABRAL-GUEVARA, DITTRICH, HORLACHER, JAMES and KNODL, cosponsored by Senators NASS and BALLWEG. Referred to Committee on State Affairs.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 16.841 of the statutes; **relating to:** testing audible devices of
2 fire alarm systems in the state capitol building on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and
3 Thursdays.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits cities, villages, towns, and counties (political subdivisions) and state agencies from requiring the testing of audible devices of fire alarm systems in the state capitol building later than 9 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. If a political subdivision or state agency has adopted an ordinance or promulgated a rule that imposes such a requirement, the bill provides that the ordinance or rule does not apply and may not be enforced.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 16.841 of the statutes is created to read:
5 **16.841 Fire alarm testing in state capitol.** (1) In this section:
6 (a) “Political subdivision” means a city, village, town, or county.
7 (b) “State agency” has the meaning given in s. 20.001 (1).
