2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 608

October 27, 2017 – Introduced by Representatives ROHRKASTE and KOLSTE, cosponsored by Senators PETROWSKI and ERPENBACH. Referred to Committee on Health.

AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

1 AN ACT *to amend* 450.062 (intro.); and *to create* 450.03 (1) (i) of the statutes; 2 relating to: delegation of the practice of pharmacy and granting rule-making

3 authority.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Generally, under current law, no person may engage in the practice of pharmacy unless the person is licensed as a pharmacist. This bill creates an exception to this prohibition for a person who is providing services as directed, supervised, and inspected by a pharmacist, subject to any rules promulgated by the Pharmacy Examining Board.

The bill also specifically allows such a person acting under a pharmacist, as well as a pharmacy student who has completed at least two years of pharmacy studies and a person who has completed pharmacy studies but whose application for licensure as a pharmacist is pending with the board, to engage in remote dispensing of prescribed drugs.
