2 tax credit for recipients of deferred action under the Deferred Action for

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a \$250 nonrefundable income tax credit for persons who have been granted deferred action under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 71.07 (5re) of the statutes is created to read:
5 71.07 (**5re**) DACA RECIPIENT CREDIT. (a) *Definitions.* In this subsection:
6 1. "Claimant" means a person who files a claim under this subsection and who
7 has been granted deferred action under the deferred action for childhood arrivals
8 program if that deferred action is not expired.
