2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 931

February 9, 2018 - Introduced by Representative Barca, cosponsored by Senator Wanggaard. Referred to Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety.

AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

AN ACT to create 20.465 (3) (dn), 20.465 (3) (hm) and 323.65 of the statutes;

relating to: active shooter safety training provided by the Division of

Emergency Management, granting rule-making authority, and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a program administered by the Division of Emergency Management to provide active shooter safety training to certain organizations. Under the bill, certain types of organizations may apply for the training. The bill requires the division to annually review applications and select applicants for training and then provide the training to those selected applicants.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert the following amounts for the purposes indicated:
