1       **Relating to:** honoring the 112th anniversary of the Girl Scouts of the United States  
2           of America.

3           Whereas, March 12, 2024, marks the 112th anniversary of the Girl Scouts of the  
4       United States of America, which began in 1912 when Savannah, Georgia, native  
5       Juliette “Daisy” Gordon Low gathered 18 girls to provide them the opportunity to  
6       develop physically, mentally, and spiritually; and

7           Whereas, for 112 years, Girl Scouting has helped build millions of girls and  
8       women of courage, confidence, and character, who act to make the world a better  
9       place; and

10          Whereas, the award-winning Girl Scout Leadership Program helps girls  
11       discover themselves and their values, connect with others, and take action to make  
12       the world a better place; and

13          Whereas, the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor in Girl Scouting,  
14       requires girls to make a measurable and sustainable difference in their

1 communities, assess a need and design a solution, find the resources and support to  
2 make it happen, complete the project, and inspire others to sustain it; and

3       Whereas, the Gold Award honors leadership in the Girl Scout tradition, and  
4 Gold Award recipients have already changed the world as high school students; and

5       Whereas, core programs around science, technology, engineering, and math  
6 (STEM); environmental stewardship; healthy living; financial literacy; and global  
7 citizenship help girls develop a solid foundation in leadership; and

8       Whereas, since its founding in 2000, the Girl Scout Research Institute has  
9 become an internationally recognized center for original research, research reviews,  
10 and surveys that provide significant insights into the lives of girls; and

11       Whereas, through its expertise and commitment to girls, the Girl Scout  
12 program is helping each girl to discover that she is a go-getter, an innovator, a  
13 risk-taker, and a leader; a G.I.R.L.; and

14       Whereas, through the dedication, time, and talent of volunteers of different  
15 backgrounds, abilities, and areas of expertise, the Girl Scout program is brought to  
16 over 39,000 girls in grades K-12 across the state of Wisconsin; and

17       Whereas, today, more than 50 million American women are Girl Scout  
18 alumnae, 2.5 million girls and adult volunteers are active members, and Girl Scouts  
19 is the largest member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, a  
20 global movement composed of more than 10 million girls in 153 countries worldwide;  
21 now, therefore, be it

22       ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** March 12, 2024, is  
23 recognized as National Girl Scout Day in Wisconsin, and the legislature

1 congratulates the Girl Scouts of the United States of America on 112 years of  
2 scouting.
