## 2021 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 150

March 10, 2022 - Introduced by Representatives BROSTOFF, SHELTON, SINICKI, SPREITZER, DRAKE, HEBL, NEUBAUER, SNODGRASS, BILLINGS, GOYKE, CONSIDINE, ANDERSON, CONLEY, HESSELBEIN, BOWEN, EMERSON, VINING, ORTIZ-VELEZ, ANDRACA, BALDEH and SUBECK, cosponsored by Senators ROYS, JACQUE, JOHNSON, AGARD and LARSON. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1     **Relating to:** condemning Russia’s unprovoked assault on Ukraine and standing in  
2             solidarity with the Ukrainian people.

3             Whereas, on February 24, 2022, Russian President Vladimir Putin declared the  
4             start of a “special military operation” in Ukraine that has threatened the nation’s  
5             sovereignty and democratically elected government; and

6             Whereas, hundreds of thousands of Russian troops have been deployed to  
7             assault Ukraine on multiple fronts in what has become a full-scale invasion and the  
8             largest mobilization of military forces in Europe since World War II; and

9             Whereas, in the days since the invasion of Ukraine has begun, the densely  
10            populated cities of Kyiv, Kharkiv, Chernihiv, Mariupol, and Kherson, among many  
11            others, have faced ground fighting, airstrikes, and occupation by Russian forces; and

12            Whereas, in multiple cities, Russian forces have begun targeting residential  
13            neighborhoods, hospitals, and radio and television towers with increasingly  
14            powerful weapons; and

1           Whereas, just days into the invasion, hundreds of Ukrainian civilians have  
2           been killed, thousands are without power or heat in freezing temperatures, and more  
3           than half a million refugees have fled the country in harsh conditions seeking safety;  
4           and

5           Whereas, Russian troops have been met with resistance across the country by  
6           both Ukrainian military forces and courageous civilians who have joined the war  
7           effort in pursuit of a free and democratic Ukraine; now, therefore, be it

8           ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** the Wisconsin  
9           State Legislature condemns the unprovoked invasion on Ukraine and stands in  
10          solidarity with the Ukrainian people as they risk their lives to defend their  
11          sovereignty.
