1	Relating to: opposing efforts by the State Department and Trump Administration
2	to allow for the deportation of Hmong and Lao U.S. residents to the Lao People's
3	Democratic Republic.
4	Whereas, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, on behalf of the Trump
5	Administration, has engaged in discussions with the Lao People's Democratic
6	Republic; and
7	Whereas, the State Department is calling on Laos to accept deported U.S.
8	residents; and
9	Whereas, Wisconsin is home to over 61,287 Hmong, Lao, Vietnamese,
10	Cambodian, and other ethnic minority groups from Laos, many of whom are refugees
11	as a result of the American War in Southeast Asia; and
12	Whereas, nearly 4,800 Hmong, Lao, and members of other ethnic minority
13	groups from Laos, 8,400 Vietnamese, and 1,500 Cambodian individuals across the
14	country have been served deportation orders; and

1	Whereas, many Hmong, Lao, and other ethnic minority groups from Laos
2	fought alongside United States soldiers in the American War in Southeast Asia; and
3	Whereas, proposed deportation would tear apart families and communities
4	across the state of Wisconsin; and
5	Whereas, Hmong, Lao, and other ethnic minority group refugees from Laos
6	have long-established roots in Wisconsin, and many have no family ties in Laos, do
7	not speak the language, and have never lived in Laos; and
8	Whereas, Vietnamese and Cambodian refugees have already been subject to
9	deportation for years and have faced hardship and retaliation; and
10	Whereas, Hmong, Lao, and other ethnic minority group refugees from Laos
11	ordered to be removed by the U.S. will face the danger of marginalization, violence,
12	or death in Laos; and
13	Whereas, members of Hmong, Lao, and other ethnic minorities of Laos in the
14	state of Wisconsin have picked up the torch in furthering the values and ideas that
15	have forged the state; and
16	Whereas, Hmong, Lao, and other ethnic minorities of Laos communities across
17	the state of Wisconsin have become successful in agriculture and farming, in small
18	business and entrepreneurship, and in working hard to support their families and
19	to make the community a better place to live; now, therefore, be it
20	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the Wisconsin
21	Legislature opposes efforts by the State Department and Trump Administration to
22	allow for the deportation of Hmong and Lao U.S. residents to the Lao People's
23	Democratic Republic; and, be it further
