- 1 **Relating to:** observing Wednesday, March 24, 2021, as Equal Pay Day in Wisconsin.
- 2 Whereas, Equal Pay Day occurs each year on the day when all women working
- 3 full-time year around have finally achieved the same annual earning as their male
- 4 counterparts did the previous year; and
- 5 Whereas, since World War II, when Wisconsin women worked in factories and
- 6 shipyards, Wisconsin women have remained the most likely in the United States to
- 7 be in the paid workforce—ranking first among the states; and
- 8 Whereas, in 2019, about 1.5 million Wisconsin women were in the labor force
- 9 (across all sectors), and according to the U.S. Census Bureau, this represented about
- 10 74 percent of the state’s female population 16 years and older; and
- 11 Whereas, 2021 marks 102 years since the passage of the 19th Amendment by
- 12 Congress on June 4, 1919, which was one of the first steps in providing equal rights
- 13 to women; and
