August 12, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives VRUWINK and POPE, cosponsored by Senators RINGHAND and ERPENBACH. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **Relating to:** honoring the Oregon High School girls soccer team on their state
2 championship.

3 Whereas, the Oregon High School girls soccer team completed an undefeated
4 season, winning seventeen games, scoring a new school record of 101 goals, and
5 winning the 2019 Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association girls soccer
6 Division II championship; and

7 Whereas, this was the fifth straight showing for the Panthers at the state
8 tournament, having been led there in previous years by Coach Julie Grutzner; and

9 Whereas, Coach Nelson Brownell, during his first year as head coach, led the
10 team to the state championship; and

11 Whereas, Athletic Director Mike Carr has created a culture of athletic and
12 academic excellence; and

13 Whereas, the Panthers' soccer senior class consisting of Maddy Swartzmiller,
14 Katie Eisele, Ella Hughes, Randey Lewis, Macie Cox, Cassie Kluck, Sydney McKee,
15 and Jenna Statz, along with teammates Melia Moyer, Ellen Legler, Brooklyn Kane,

1 Avary Fanning, Chloe Schwartz, Hanna Rohrer, Kaitlyn Schrimpf, Emma
2 Halverson, Lauren Denu, Ashley Hanson, Sage Sauer, Jenna Bennett, Aidan
3 Hampton, Bri Sauer, Mara McCombs, Emily Statz, and Payton Lang, have
4 demonstrated superior athleticism and sportsmanship; and

5 Whereas, the team was ranked twenty-fourth best in the nation; Coach Nelson
6 Brownell was named Coach of the Year by the Wisconsin State Journal; and team
7 members Sydney McKee and Melia Moyer were awarded spots on the All-State
8 Soccer Teams; now, therefore, be it

9 ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** the Wisconsin
10 Legislature recognizes and honors the Oregon High School girls soccer team for their
11 superior commitment to teammates and athletic achievements.
