1 **AN ACT to amend** 196.374 (3) (b) 2. of the statutes; **relating to:** funding of the
2 Focus on Energy program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes changes to the funding of statewide energy efficiency and renewable resources programs, known as Focus on Energy, that current law requires investor-owned electric and natural gas utilities to fund. Under the bill, the Public Service Commission must require those utilities to spend 2.4 percent of their annual operating revenues derived from retail sales to fund Focus on Energy and related programs. Under current law, the amount those utilities must spend is 1.2 percent of their annual operating revenues derived from retail sales.
