Catch Title: Food Freedom Act-amendments.

Subject: Expands permissible sales of homemade foods under the Wyoming Food

Freedom Act.

Summary/Major Elements:

This act specifies that, in addition to non-potentially hazardous foods, a person may sell eggs
and dairy products under the Wyoming Food Freedom Act. The Act allows producers of
certain homemade foods to sell their products to end consumers without requiring
certification, regulation, license or inspection as long as the producer complies with the
provisions of the Act.

- This act also defines the term "designated agent." A designated agent is a person, consignment
 model market or food freedom store that a producer may designate to act on the producer's
 behalf to facilitate transactions, including the marketing, transport, storage and delivery of
 food.
- The Wyoming Department of Agriculture is prohibited from setting standards for food and health inspections applicable to the Food Freedom Act that are more stringent than standards established by the United States Department of Agriculture.
