The department of corrections shall issue a person convicted of a nonviolent 9 10 felony or nonviolent felonies arising out of the same 11 occurrence or related course of events may apply in writing 12 to the state board of parole for a certificate which 13 restores the person's voting rights lost pursuant to W.S. 14 6-10-106. The application shall specifically state that the requirements of this subsection have been met and shall be 15 16 on a form approved by the state board of parole. 12 (ii) "Criminal history record information" means 13 information, records and data compiled by criminal justice agencies on individuals for the purpose of identifying 14 criminal offenders consisting of identifiable descriptions 15 16 of the offenders and notations or a summary of arrests, indictments, information, pre-trial 17 detentions, proceedings, nature and disposition of criminal charges, 18 19 sentencing, rehabilitation, incarceration, correctional 20 supervision and release. Criminal history record 21 information is limited to information recorded as the result of the initiation of criminal proceedings. It does 22 23 not include intelligence data, analytical prosecutorial
