

## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0027

Extension of energy producing states coalition.

Sponsored by: Joint Minerals, Business and Economic  
Development Interim Committee

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the legislature; extending the energy  
2 producing states coalition as specified; requiring a  
3 report; providing an appropriation; and providing for an  
4 effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.**

9

10 (a) The participation of Wyoming legislators in the  
11 energy producing states coalition, authorized by 2011  
12 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 92, Section 1, is hereby  
13 continued.

15 (b) Legislators appointed pursuant to this act shall  
16 be authorized by the management council of the legislature

1 to attend meetings as the council determines necessary to  
2 accomplish the purposes of this act, and shall receive  
3 salary, per diem and mileage for the performance of their  
4 duties under this act as provided in W.S. 28-5-101.  
5 Appointed legislators shall provide a single report to the  
6 council not later than October 1, 2012, including any  
7 suggested legislation for referral to the appropriate  
8 legislative committee for consideration.

9

10 (c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b)  
11 of this section, the appropriation contained in section 2  
12 of this act may be expended to coordinate and provide  
13 meeting facilities and other requirements for the energy  
14 producing states coalition with the approval of management  
15 council.

16

17 **Section 2.** For purposes of this act, there is  
18 appropriated from the general fund twenty-four thousand  
19 five hundred dollars (\$24,500.00) to the legislative  
20 service office. This appropriation shall be for the period  
21 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending  
22 June 30, 2013.

1           **Section 3.**   This act is effective immediately upon  
2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
4 Constitution.
