### HOUSE BILL NO. HB0033

Highway fund-assignment of fine and penalty revenues.

Sponsored by: Joint Transportation, Highways and Military Affairs Interim Committee

### A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to highway funding; assigning penalty and
- 2 fine revenues to the highway fund as specified;
- 3 continuously appropriating such deposited monies to the
- 4 transportation commission for specified uses; and providing
- 5 for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 5-9-106, 5-9-149, 7-10-105, 8-1-109,
- 10 13-10-207(f), 14-6-247(a)(vi), 20-2-402(c),
- 11 20-6-106(m)(viii), 22-25-108(e), 24-1-119, 27-3-706(a)(ii)
- 12 and (iii), 30-5-127, 31-1-203(c), 33-1-109, 33-24-113(f),
- 13 33-24-122(b), 33-24-153(f), 33-28-111(c), 33-44-112,

1 5-9-106. Disposition of money collected for

2 violations of city or town ordinances; disposition of fines

3 and penalties under general state laws.

4

5 All money collected by a judge of a circuit court for

6 violations of ordinances of a city or town shall be paid

7 into the general fund of the city or town whose ordinance

8 was violated. The circuit court shall keep separate account

9 books of funds for ordinance violations as designated by

10 the Wyoming supreme court. All fines and penalties under

11 the general laws of the state shall be paid into the county

12 treasury to the credit of the public school fund of the

13 county highway fund as required by article 16, section 14

14 of the Wyoming constitution.

16 **5-9-149.** Bank accounts.

17

18 The accounting system established by the Wyoming supreme

19 court may provide for bank accounts for each circuit court

20 in which money received by the circuit court may be

21 deposited and disbursed as provided therein, and for such

22 records, reports and procedures as the supreme court

23 requires. Money received as fines, forfeitures or court

24 costs may not be deposited in the same bank account as

money received in civil matters. If a bank account is 1 established into which fines, costs or forfeitures are 2 deposited, the accounting system established by the supreme 3 court shall require, where available, the use of accounts 4 5 in a financial institution listed in W.S. 9-4-817(a) which may earn interest, in which the deposits are subject to 6 payment upon demand and which are insured or secured as 7 provided in W.S. 9-4-817(c). Interest earned on deposits of 8 9 fines and forfeitures in such accounts shall be forwarded monthly to the county treasurer and credited to the county 10 11 public school fund state treasurer for credit to the highway fund as required by article 16, section 14 of the 12 13 Wyoming constitution. Interest earned on all other deposits in such accounts shall be forwarded to the state treasurer 14 15 quarterly and credited to the victim's compensation account created by W.S. 1-40-114(a). 16

# 7-10-105. Disposition of forfeited proceeds.

20 Any proceeds recovered as a result of the forfeiture of
21 bail in any criminal case shall be paid into the county
22 treasury to the credit of the public school fund of the
23 county in which the defendant was admitted to bail to the

1 state treasurer for credit to the highway fund as required

2 by article 16, section 14 of the Wyoming constitution.

Any person who fails to 22 respond to any request for information may be sanctioned by

the department by imposing administrative penalties not to

exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The department shall

1 enter the employer information into the state directory of 2 new hires within five (5) business days after receipt of 3 the employer information. Any person who, good faith, provides information 15 in to the acting department under this paragraph shall not be liable for 16 17 civil damages as a result of the information provided. The department shall deposit remit any penalties collected 18 under this paragraph in the public school fund of the 19 respective counties to the state treasurer for credit to 20 21 the highway fund as required by article 16, section 14 of 22 the Wyoming constitution;

1 22-25-108. Failure of candidate or committee to file

Any candidate failing to file the reports 4 5 required by W.S. 22-25-106 within the times required by that section is subject to a civil penalty and costs, 6 including reasonable attorney's fees not to exceed five 7 hundred dollars (\$500.00), as hereinafter provided. 8 9 action to impose a civil penalty may be prosecuted by and in the name of any candidate adversely affected by the 10 violation, any political party, any district attorney or 11 the attorney general. No filing fee shall be charged for 12 13 the filing of an action under this subsection nor shall a fee be charged for service of process. Civil penalties 14 shall be paid to the clerk of court for deposit to the 15 public school fund of the county in which the fine was 16 17 assessed remittance to the state treasurer for credit to the highway fund as required by article 16, section 14 of 18 19 the Wyoming constitution. The civil penalty imposed under this subsection shall be not more than one thousand dollars 20 21 (\$1,000.00).

2 There is created a fund known as the state highway fund, to 3 the credit of which the state treasurer, who is designated 4 as the state official to receive all amounts paid by the 5 United States under the act of congress approved July 11, 1916, shall place all monies previously received for the 6 fund, all money subsequently received from the United 7 States, under cooperative agreements as authorized, all 8 9 money derived from taxes levied for such purpose or appropriated for the fund, all monies received from the 10 for highway construction 11 of state bonds improvement, all money received from the counties under 12 13 cooperative agreements as hereinbefore authorized, and all other monies received from donations or bequests, which may 14 be accepted by the commission on behalf of the state of 15 Wyoming, or from any source designated by law for that 16 17 purpose. All monies in the fund shall be available for the purpose of this act without further appropriation and no 18 warrant shall be drawn on the fund excepting on a voucher 19 department director of 20 approved by the the 21 transportation or an assistant authorized by the director 22 and approved by the transportation commission. In addition 23 to any other accounts established within the highway fund, all fine and penalty monies collected pursuant to article 24

16, section 14 of the Wyoming constitution shall be 1 deposited into a special account within the highway fund, 2 3 in the state of Wyoming's online financial system. All monies in the special account including earned interest are 4 5 continuously appropriated to the transportation commission and shall be applied only for the construction, improvement 6 or maintenance of Wyoming's highways. It is provided that 7 seventy-five percent (75%) of the amount of any bond issue 8 9 subsequently issued by the state of Wyoming for the 10 construction or improvement of state highways, after the 11 payment of overhead expense, shall be apportioned to and spent in each county in the proportion which the assessed 12 13 valuation of each county by the last general assessment bears to the total assessment of the state. 14

(a) A person who knowingly, or with deliberate ignorance or reckless disregard of the true facts or the requirements of this act, violates or attempts to violate W.S. 27-3-507 or any other provision of this act related to determining the assignment of a contribution rate, or who knowingly advises another to violate the requirements of W.S. 27-3-507 or any other provision of this act related to

1 determining the assignment of a contribution rate, shall be 2 subject to the following penalties:

(ii) A person who is not an employer shall be 4 5 subject to a civil penalty of not more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds received by the division under 6 this paragraph shall be paid over to the state treasurer to 7 be credited to the public school fund of the county in 8 9 which the violation for which the penalty imposed occurred highway fund as required by article 16, section 14 of the 10 11 Wyoming constitution;

31-1-203. Special enforcement officers; summons and notice to appear for violations; deposit for appearance; disposition of deposit.

The employees designated under subsection (a) of 16 17 this section upon issuing a summons shall deliver to the offender a notice to appear which shall describe the nature 18 of the offense, with instructions for the offender to 19 report to the nearest circuit court designated in the 20 21 notice. The employee may accept a deposit for appearance. The court coordinator shall establish a uniform deposit for 22 appearance schedule for each violation of the statutes set 23 forth in subsection (b) of this section. If the employee 24

1 accepts a deposit for appearance from the offender, he shall give a signed, numbered receipt for the amount 2 received and shall write the receipt number on the notice 3 to appear. The employee shall deliver the deposit and a 4 5 copy of the notice to appear to the circuit court before whom the offender is to appear and the circuit court judge 6 shall give a receipt to the employee for the amount of the 7 deposit. The circuit court shall assume jurisdiction after 8 9 filing of a complaint and appearance by the offender. In addition to other remedies, in the event of a 8 (d) 9 chronic failure to provide services or services that fail 10 to meet the applicable standard of care for the profession 11 involved or a continuing condition creating detriment to the health, safety or welfare of recipients of 12 13 home and community based waiver services, the department 14 may impose a civil penalty upon the provider. For each day of continuing violation, the civil penalty shall not exceed 15 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or one percent (1%) of the 16 17 amount paid to the provider during the previous twelve (12) months, whichever is greater, and any administrative 18 penalty assessed under this section shall be paid over to 19 the state treasurer who shall remit the monies to the 20 21 county treasurer to the credit of the public school fund of 22 the county in which the violation occurred highway fund as required by article 16, section 14 of the Wyoming 23

1 constitution, except as otherwise provided by federal law

2 for Medicaid certified nursing facilities.

4 Section 2. This act shall be effective only upon the

5 Wyoming Legislature's passage of House Joint Resolution No.

6 2 and ratification by a majority of electors in Wyoming of

7 the constitutional amendment proposed in House Joint

8 Resolution No. 2 which creates Article 16, Section 14 and

9 repeals Article 7, Section 5.
