A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public health; creating the primary care
- 2 support program; authorizing grants as specified; providing
- 3 for a local match as specified; requiring reports;
- 4 providing appropriations; providing a repeal date; and
- 5 providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 Section 1. W.S. 9-2-127 is created to read:

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- 11 9-2-127. Primary care support program created;
- 12 account established; grant criteria.

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- 14 (a) There is created the Wyoming primary care support
- 15 program administered by the Wyoming department of health.

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1 (b) The purpose of the program is to provide support

2 to Wyoming entities operating primary care centers in need

3 of immediate financial assistance. Grants under subsection

4 (e) of this section shall enhance the delivery of primary

5 health care services for underserved and vulnerable

6 populations.

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8 (c) In order to qualify for the grants, a primary

9 care center shall provide services to the public regardless

10 of ability to pay and provide proof of:

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12 (i) Designation as a federally qualified health

13 center or rural health clinic;

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15 (ii) Steps taken to become a federally qualified

16 health center or rural health clinic; or

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18 (iii) Why status as a federally qualified or

19 rural health clinic would not result in improved revenues

20 to the clinic.

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22 (d) The primary care support account is created. The

23 account shall consist of those funds appropriated to the

24 account by the legislature and all monies received from

- 1 federal grants and other contributions, grants, gifts,
- 2 transfers, bequests and donations to the account. The
- 3 account is specifically empowered to accept grants, gifts,
- 4 transfers, bequests and donations. Funds in the account
- 5 are continuously appropriated to the department for the
- 6 purpose of providing grants under subsections (e) and (f)
- 7 of this section.

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- 9 (e) The department shall establish by rule and
- 10 regulation an application procedure and calendar for
- 11 primary care support grants and adopt other rules as
- 12 necessary to implement this section.

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- 14 (f) The department may provide new access point
- 15 incubator grants, subject to the following:

16

- 17 (i) Grants may be made to community health
- 18 centers and rural health clinics for one-time startup costs
- 19 of a new center or clinic, for existing centers or clinics
- 20 to expand the population served or services provided or for
- 21 existing or new centers or clinics to facilitate compliance

22 with quality criteria;

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1 (ii) Grants to any one (1) facility shall not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00); 2 3 (iii) Grant applications shall include evidence 4 5 of a commitment of local matching funds of at least twentyfive percent (25%) of the grant amount in cash, inkind or 6 both. 7 8 9 (g) A grant recipient under this section shall agree 10 to provide health care services in an underserved community of the state, from among a list of communities developed by 11 the department, for a period of at least three (3) years 12 under the agreement. The recipient shall accept as its 13 first priority and treat without reservation patients 14 qualified under the Medical Assistance and Services Act, 15 Title XVIII of the federal Social Security Act and the 16 17 child health insurance program who seek medical care which the health care provider is qualified to provide. 18 19 The department of health, office of rural health 20 21 care, shall: 22 (i) Conduct education 23 outreach and

24 persons, entities and groups interested in forming a

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- 1 community health center or rural health clinic and
- 2 submitting a new access point grant application to the
- 3 United States department of health and human services,
- 4 health resources and services administration;

- 6 (ii) Collect and maintain appropriate data
- 7 regarding the primary care support program's effect on
- 8 improvements in community and rural health.

9

10 (j) This section is repealed effective June 30, 2017.

11

12 Section 2.

- 14 (a) There is appropriated ten million dollars
- 15 (\$10,000,000.00) from the general fund to the primary care
- 16 support account. This appropriation shall be for the
- 17 period beginning with the effective date of this act. This
- 18 appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of
- 19 grants to community health centers and rural health clinics
- 20 pursuant to W.S. 9-2-127(e). Notwithstanding any other
- 21 provision of law, this appropriation shall not be
- 22 transferred or expended for any other purpose. Any
- 23 unexpended monies in the account shall not revert but shall

1 remain in the account to be expended for the purposes

2 specified in this act.

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4 (b) There is appropriated two hundred thousand 5 dollars (\$200,000.00) from the general fund to the department of health. This appropriation shall be for the 6 period beginning with the effective date of this act and 7 ending June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall only be 8 9 expended for the purpose of administering the program created pursuant to W.S. 9-2-127(h). Notwithstanding any 10 other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 11 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 12 13 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

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2012.

17 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
