for

1 AN ACT relating to courts; authorizing the assignment of 2 cases and proceedings from circuit courts and district 3 courts to chancery court judges; specifying requirements 4 for transfers; authorizing retired chancery court judges to 5 provide judicial service as specified; making conforming 6 amendments; and providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9

Section 1. W.S. 5-1-106(f), 5-3-112(a)(intro) and (iii), 5-9-131(a)(intro) and 5-13-116 by creating new subsections (b) and (c) are amended to read:

14 5-1-106. Retirement of judges of the supreme court or 15 district courts; pension; assignment of retired judges.

2 (f) Any justice of the supreme court, chancery court 3 judge or district court judge of this state, who has 4 retired pursuant to the provisions of this section, and who 5 is not practicing law, may, notwithstanding his retirement, be called upon, with his consent, at the request of a 6 district court judge or circuit court judge, with the 7 8 consent of the chief justice, or by the chief justice, and 9 assigned to service on any court. A retired justice or 10 judge shall receive as a salary during any period of assignment an amount equal to the current compensation of a 11 12 judge of the court to which he is assigned. The salary 13 received by a retired justice or judge during any period of assignment shall not affect the receipt of any retirement 14 15 allowance received by the retired justice or judge during 16 the period of assignment. Assignments of retired justices 17 or judges under this section shall only be made in a manner that does not jeopardize the qualified status of state 18 19 retirement plans established by the Wyoming legislature. 20 When called to serve, a retired judge or justice shall 21 receive the same per diem and travel allowances as allowed 22 active judges or justices. Per diem, allowances and

compensation shall be paid from the contingent fund of the 1 2 court to which the judge or justice is assigned. 3 4 5-3-112. Assignment to circuit court judge or 5 chancery court judge. 6 7 (a) A judge of the district court may assign to a circuit court judge or a chancery court judge any case or 8 proceeding within the jurisdiction of the district court 9 10 subject only to the following restrictions: 11 12 (iii) Consent of each plaintiff and each defendant in a civil action; wherein the amount in 13 14 controversy is greater than fifty thousand dollars 15 (\$50,000.00); and 16 17 5-9-131. Assignment to district court judge or 18 chancery court judge. 19 20 (a) A circuit court judge may assign to a district 21 court judge or a chancery court judge any case or proceeding within the jurisdiction of the circuit court 22 subject only to the following restrictions: 23
