6	licensure boards; refining the cost allocation calculation
7	for services provided to licensure boards; delegating
8	licensure authority to committee and staff; providing
9	authority to contract and hire staff; amending provisions
10	relating to deposit of monies collected; making conforming
11	changes; and providing for an effective date.

2	GENERAL PROCEDURES FOR LICENSURE BOARDS

4	33-1-301. Purpose and scope.
5	
6	(a) The purpose of this article is to establish
7	procedures for the operation of boards authorized to
8	establish examination, inspection, permit or license fees
9	for any profession or occupation regulated under this title
10	or under W.S. 11-25-105, 21-2-802 and 23-2-414.
11	
12	(b) The provisions of this article supplement the
13	statutes related to the specific board and profession
14	regulated. If the statutes governing a board or regulated
15	profession are silent or unclear the provisions of this
16	article shall be applied. The statutes governing the
17	operation or creation of a specific board or commission are
18	effective and controlling to the extent they conflict with
19	a provision of this article.

21	33-1-302. Duties of licensure boards.
22	
23	(a) Except as otherwise specifically provided by
24	statute, a board authorized to establish examination,

- 1 inspection, permit or license fees for any profession or
- 2 occupation regulated under this title or under W.S.
- 3 11-25-105, 21-2-802 or 23-2-414 shall:

- 5 (i) Prescribe and enforce rules, regulations and
- 6 policies for its own government consistent with the laws of
- 7 the state and rules and regulations;

- 9 (ii) Keep minutes of all meetings at which
- 10 official action is taken and a record of all official acts;

11

- 12 (iii) Fix the time and place of regular
- 13 meetings, provided, that there shall be at least one (1)
- 14 meeting per year;

15

- 16 (iv) Require adequate internal control
- 17 structures to ensure the processing and accounting of all
- 18 financial transactions and, at a minimum, conduct periodic
- 19 audits of internal controls and receipts to determine:

- 21 (A) Whether expenditures are made for the
- 22 benefit of the state in administration or operation of the

1 (B) Whether the financial reports of audited entity are presented fairly; and 2 3 4 (C) Whether the entity has complied with 5 applicable laws and regulations. 6 (v) Provide a copy of the audit required by 7 paragraph (iv) of this subsection to the department of 8 9 audit, the state auditor and the legislative service 10 office; 11 12 (vi) Prohibit members from receiving compensation as an employee of the board or commission 13 including but not limited to positions of executive 14 director, administrative assistant or other 15 employee serving in a similar capacity; 16 17 (vii) Compensate each member for per diem and 18 mileage for attending and traveling to and from meetings, 19 20 hearings and other activities necessary in the performance 21 of the duties of the office in the same manner and amount 22 as members of the Wyoming legislature. Members who are state employees that receive compensation from their 23 employers for activities performed pursuant to this title 24

1 or under W.S. 11-25-105, 21-2-802 or 23-2-414 shall not

2 receive additional compensation but shall receive mileage

3 and per diem as provided under this paragraph if they are

4 not reimbursed by their employers;

5

Receive budget, fiscal, administrative 6 (viii) and clerical service from the department of administration 7 information as provided in W.S. 9-2-1002(b) 8 9 9-2-1707(b)(iii), except as provided hereinafter. The 10 licensure board or commission shall pay a reasonable rate 11 established by rule and regulation of the department of administration and information for services necessary to 12 13 support the operation of the licensure board or commission. A board or commission may terminate services described 14 15 herein upon demonstration to the department administration and information, in the manner and form 16 17 determined sufficient by the department of administration information, the board 18 and that or commission is financially independent and able to secure staff to perform 19 20 the functions necessary for independent operation;

22 (ix) If applicable, pay the amount determined 23 appropriate for any cost allocation program supporting
