## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to ultraviolet tanning devices; prohibiting
- 2 allowing the use of ultraviolet tanning devices by minors
- 3 under fifteen (15) years of age as specified; requiring
- 4 parental consent for use of ultraviolet tanning devices by
- 5 minors between fifteen (15) and eighteen (18) years of age;
- 6 providing definitions; providing criminal penalties; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10

11 **Section 1.** W.S. 14-3-108 is created to read:

12

- 13 14-3-108. Use of ultraviolet tanning devices by
- 14 persons who have not reached the age of majority; consent
- 15 required; penalties.

16

1 No person other than the minor's parent or legal guardian shall knowingly allow a minor who has not reached 2 3 fifteen (15) years of age to use an ultraviolet tanning 4 device, either alone or in the presence of 5 individual. No person shall knowingly allow a minor age fifteen (15) years to the age of majority to use an 6 ultraviolet tanning device, except with written consent 7 obtained from the minor's parent or legal guardian. 8 9 parent or guardian shall not be required to stay at the facility during the tanning session or be in the tanning 10 11 room or booth with the minor. Any person other than the minor's parent or legal guardian allowing the use of an 12 13 ultraviolet tanning device by a minor shall demand proof of age prior to allowing the use of an ultraviolet tanning 14 device. A motor vehicle driver's license, a registration 15 card issued under the federal Selective Service Act, an 16 17 identification card issued to a member of the armed forces, a valid United States passport, a tribal identification 18 card issued by the governing body of the Eastern Shoshone 19 20 tribe of Wyoming or the Northern Arapahoe tribe of Wyoming 21 or an identification card issued by the department of transportation is prima facie evidence of the age and 22 identity under this section. 23 Proof that the person 24 allowing the use of the ultraviolet tanning device

1 demanded, was shown and acted in reasonable reliance upon

2 the information contained in any one (1) of the above

3 documents as identification and proof of age is a defense

4 to any criminal prosecution under this section.

6 (b) Any person violating this section is guilty of a

7 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than

8 six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty

9 dollars (\$750.00), or both.

11 (c) As used in this section:

12

13 (i) "Consent" means that the parent or legal

14 guardian appears at the first time the minor uses the

15 ultraviolet tanning device and signs a written consent form

16 in the presence of the owner or an employee of the

17 facility. The minor's parent or legal guardian may

18 withdraw this consent at anytime. Unless so withdrawn,

19 this consent shall be valid for twelve (12) months from the

20 date the written consent form is signed;

22 (ii) "Ultraviolet tanning device" means

23 equipment that emits electromagnetic radiation with

24 wavelengths in the air between two hundred (200) and four

1 hundred (400) nanometers used for tanning of the skin,

2 including, but not limited to, a sunlamp, tanning booth or

3 tanning bed, but does not include equipment that emits

4 ultraviolet radiation used by a health care professional in

5 the treatment of disease or used pursuant to a

6 prescription.

8 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2010.
