13 **35-11-402.** Establishment of standards.

1 (a) The council shall, upon recommendation by the 2 advisory board through the administrator and the director, 3 establish rules and regulations pursuant to the following 4 reclamation standards for the affected areas, including but 5 not limited to:

(x) Rules and regulations for the criteria for 7 review and information and public notice requirements for 8 9 permit revisions. Subject to this paragraph, a permit may 10 be revised without public notice or hearing for revisions, including incidental boundary revisions to the area covered 11 12 by the permit, if these do not propose significant alterations in the reclamation plan. Subject to applicable 13 standards, any permit, except for surface coal mining 14 permits, may be revised, in the permitted area, 15 16 identifying proposed alterations to the mining reclamation plan in the annual report or addendum thereto, 17 or by obtaining prior approval from the director, at the 18 19 operator's discretion. If the surface landowner is 20 different from the permit holder or the mineral owner, no 21 permit or reclamation plan shall be revised or altered in 22 any way under this paragraph without first receiving the 23 surface owner's consent in writing;
