(g) A person who has qualified for resident tuition 1 2 under subsection (e) or (h) of this section shall remain 3 qualified in subsequent years if the person pursues one or 4 more courses of education while remaining continuously enrolled, other than during regularly scheduled breaks, 5 lives in the state during the term of enrollment and, if 6 the person is eligible through a transfer of eligibility 7 8 pursuant to 38 U.S.C. 3319, the transfer has not been 9 validly revoked. 10 11 (h) A person shall qualify as a resident for purposes 12 of tuition at the University of Wyoming or a Wyoming 13 community college if he provides a certification of service 14 or other proof that he served in an AmeriCorps program in this state for at least twelve (12) months and that service 15 16 terminated not more than twelve (12) months preceding 17 application for resident tuition. 18 21-18-202.
