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state traffic laws is in the best interest of the residents 1 of the Wind River Indian Reservation, Fremont County and 2 all users of public roads and highways on the Wind River 3 Indian Reservation. The grant of authority under this 4 5 section is intended to promote the safety of all users of public streets and highways on the Wind River Indian 6 Reservation by increasing the number of law enforcement 7 officers available to quickly and effectively respond to 8 9 traffic violations, including driving under the influence of alcohol. This section is not intended to alter or limit 10 in any manner the current authority or jurisdiction of 11 state and local law enforcement officers to respond to or 12 enforce violations of state law on the Wind River Indian 13 14 Reservation.

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(b) Tribal law enforcement officers are authorized to
enforce state traffic laws as set forth in this section.
The authority of tribal law enforcement officers under this
section shall be limited to:

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(i) Exercising the authority a Wyoming peace officer is authorized to exercise in the enforcement of state traffic laws within the Wind River Indian Reservation; and

1 2 (ii) Fresh pursuit of a person whom the officer 3 has probable cause to believe has committed a violation of 4 state traffic law within the Wind River Indian a 5 Reservation and enforcing violations of state traffic laws that have occurred outside of the Wind River 6 Indian Reservation observed in the course of the fresh pursuit. 7 8 9 (c) A tribal law enforcement officer may exercise the authority granted by this section provided the entity 10 employing the officer has entered into an agreement with 11 the state to comply with all applicable requirements and 12 13 regulations of the department of transportation and the department of health with respect to implementation and 14 administration of state traffic laws, including 15 the administration of chemical tests, and to pay the expenses 16 associated with: 17 18 Chemical tests administered at the direction 19 (i) of a tribal law enforcement officer; 20 21

(ii) The cost of transporting prisoners; and

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(iii) Medical costs incurred in the care of 1 2 offenders until the offender is transferred to a county 3 detention facility. 4 5 (d) A tribal law enforcement officer in connection with the enforcement of state traffic laws pursuant to this 6 section may: 7 8 9 (i) Testify in state courts as a law enforcement witness; 10 11 12 (ii) Issue citations into state court as 13 provided in W.S. 7-2-103; 14 15 (iii) Apply for search warrants, arrest warrants and other appropriate writs in circuit or state district 16 17 court; 18 (iv) Execute warrants and writs outside the Wind 19 20 River Indian Reservation provided the officer is 21 accompanied by a peace officer employed by the jurisdiction in which the action is taken; 22 23

(v) Utilize the chemical testing laboratory of 1 2 the Wyoming public health laboratory; and 3 (vi) Transport prisoners. 4 5 If an offender is taken into custody by a tribal 6 (e) officer, the offender shall be promptly delivered to the 7 appropriate county detention center unless the offender 8 9 requires immediate medical attention. An offender requiring immediate medical attention shall be delivered to the 10 11 appropriate county detention facility when the offender is released from medical care. 12 13 (f) A tribal law enforcement officer making an arrest 14 or issuing a citation for violation of a state traffic law 15 pursuant to this section shall: 16 17 Report the action to the appropriate county 18 (i) or state law enforcement officials with jurisdiction over 19 20 the matter within twenty-four (24) hours; 21 22 (ii) Insure that all necessary copies of citations and other documents are filed in the appropriate 23

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state court and with the appropriate county prosecuting
 attorney within twenty-four (24) hours; and

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4 (iii) Comply with all statutory, regulatory and 5 administrative requirements of the department of 6 transportation and the department of health applicable to 7 the administration and enforcement of state traffic laws.

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9 All pension, relief, disability, workers' (q) compensation insurance and other benefits which apply to 10 11 the officer and to the entity by whom he is employed when the officer is engaged in the performance of his duties 12 enforcing tribal or federal law within the Wind River 13 Indian Reservation shall apply to the same degree and 14 extent when the officer is enforcing state traffic laws 15 pursuant to this section. 16

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Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 18 (h) contrary, any tribal enforcement officer 19 law while 20 enforcing a state traffic law pursuant to this section 21 shall, for civil liability arising out of such services, be 22 considered a peace officer and employee of the state of Wyoming for purposes of coverage and representation under 23 24 the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, W.S. 1-39-101 through

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1 1-39-121, and the state self-insurance program, W.S. 1-41-101 through 1-41-111. This subsection shall not apply 2 3 if liability arising out of such services lies against the United States or would lie against the United States if the 4 5 action were properly brought under federal law. 6 Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to 7 (ij) limit or prevent the sheriff of Fremont or Hot Springs 8 9 County from deputizing a tribal law enforcement officer 10 under his separate authority and in his discretion. 11 Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to 12 (k) give any federal law enforcement officer or entity not 13 14 specified in this section any authority to enforce state 15 laws. 16 17 (m) It shall not be a defense to any charge or arrest made under a state traffic law pursuant to this section 18 that the contact between the officer and offender resulted 19 20 from a roadblock within the Wind River Indian Reservation 21 which meets federal constitutional standards, but is not in 22 compliance with title 7, chapter 17 of the Wyoming statutes. 23

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1 (n) As used in this section: 2 (i) "Chemical test" means as defined by W.S. 3 4 31-5-233(a)(viii); 5 (ii) "Peace officer" means as defined by W.S. 6 7-2-101(a)(iv)(A) and (B); 7 8 9 (iii) "State traffic laws" means title 31 of the Wyoming statutes and regulations promulgated pursuant to 10 11 those statutes; 12 (iv) "Tribal law enforcement officer" means any 13 duly authorized law enforcement officer employed by the 14 Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Northern Arapaho Tribe or 15 Eastern Shoshone Tribe who is authorized to enforce tribal 16 or federal law within and upon the Wind River Indian 17 Reservation and who: 18 19 20 successfully completed a basic (A) Has 21 course of professional law enforcement training at the 22 Bureau of Indian Affairs Police Academy; 23

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1 (B) Has successfully completed a basic 2 course of law enforcement training at the Federal Law 3 Enforcement Training Center; 4 5 (C) Has successfully completed a basic course of peace officer law enforcement training at the 6 Wyoming Law Enforcement Academy; 7 8 9 (D) Has completed the requirements and been certified as a peace officer by the Wyoming Peace Officers 10 11 Standards and Training Commission; or 12 13 (E) Has received training equivalent to the training in subparagraphs (A) through (D) of this paragraph 14 as approved and certified in writing for each such officer 15 by the Wyoming attorney general. 16 17 "Wind River Indian Reservation" means that 18 (v) part of the Wind River Indian Reservation that is "Indian 19 20 Country" as defined in Title 18, United States Code, 21 section 1151. 22 Section 2.
