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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2608 is created to read:

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12 9-2-2608. Workplace safety grant program.

- 14 (a) The department of workforce services shall
- 15 administer a program of workplace safety grants as provided
- 16 in this section.

2 (b) Upon application from a public or private
3 employer, the department may provide grants to the employer
4 to increase and provide for effective participation in
5 workplace safety programs created and administered under
6 title 27, chapter 11 or 14 of Wyoming statutes. Grant
7 recipients under this section shall:

9 (i) Document the number of employees covered
10 under the workplace safety programs created or enhanced by
11 the grant;

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13 (ii) Document decreases in occupational hazards
14 accomplished through participation in the workplace safety
15 programs.

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17 (c) The department shall promulgate rules and
18 regulations for administration of the grant program
19 provided in this section. Grants under this section shall
20 be conditioned on the following:

22 (i) The recipient of the grant initiating or 23 participating in a workplace safety program created and

administered under title 27, chapter 11 or 14 of Wyoming 1 2 statutes; 3 4 (ii) An in-cash cost sharing contribution of at 5 least ten percent (10%) from the employer; 6 (iii) No grant under this program shall be made 7 to any individual employer in excess of ten thousand 8 9 dollars (\$10,000.00); 10 11 (iv) Funds granted under this section shall be

11 (iv) Funds granted under this section shall be
12 used solely for enhancement or implementation of workplace
13 safety programs, including for assistance in the purchase
14 of safety equipment necessary to carry out the programs
15 created and administered under title 27, chapter 11 or 14

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of Wyoming statutes.

16	(a) There is appropriated two hundred fifty thousand

dollars (\$250,000.00) from the Wyoming industrial accident 17 18 fund to the department of workforce services. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 19 20 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2014. This 21 appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of funding grants under W.S. 9-2-2608 created by this act. 22 23 Notwithstanding any other provision of this law,

appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

1 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds

2 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

3 by law on June 30, 2014.

4

5 The occupational health and safety division is authorized an additional five (5) full-time equivalent 6 positions to be retained as occupational health and safety 7 consultants and not compliance officers. In addition, 8 9 three (3) full-time equivalent positions shall be allocated department of workforce 10 the services to 11 occupational health and safety division. The positions shall be as determined by the governor and shall be filled 12 13 only for the purposes of increasing occupational health and The funding associated with the 14 safety consultations. transferred positions shall be transferred from the Wyoming 15 industrial accident fund to the occupational health and 16 17 safety division. There is additionally appropriated one million thirty-five thousand nine hundred eighteen dollars 18 (\$1,035,918.00) from the Wyoming industrial accident fund 19 20 to the occupational health and safety division. 21 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 22 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2014. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of 23 additional full-time equivalent 24 funding the five (5)

1 positions authorized by this subsection only for

2 occupational health and safety consultations.

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this

4 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

5 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds

6 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

7 by law on June 30, 2014. Funding for the eight (8)

8 positions specified in this subsection shall be included in

9 the division's 2015-2016 standard biennial budget request.

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11 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

14 Constitution.
