for

AN ACT relating to school finance; modifying the school 1 reconfiguration requirements under the education resource 2 grant funding model; clarifying and 3 block defining requirements, expanding application as specified 4 providing an exception; updating the hedonic wage index 5 used within the regional cost adjustment to the education 6 block grant model; providing 7 resource technical corrections; clarifying methodology for computing model 8 external cost adjustments; adjusting cost of education 9 study components as specified; providing for a review of 10 the WCLI; providing appropriations; and providing for 11 effective dates. 12

14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

15

1 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-9-101(d), 21-13-309(m)(v)(C), by

2 creating a new paragraph (vi) and (o) and 21-15-123(e) are

3 amended to read:

5 21-9-101. Educational programs for schools;

6 standards; core of knowledge and skills; special needs

7 programs; class size requirements; cocurricular activities.

9 (d) In addition to subsections (b) and (c) of this

10 section, each school district within this state shall

11 endeavor to maintain when practicable, in kindergarten

12 through grade three (3) within the district, an average

13 class size of no more than twenty (20) sixteen (16)

14 students per teacher, excluding children with disabilities

15 who spend more than fifty percent (50%) of their time

16 outside of regular classroom instruction.

18 21-13-309. Determination of amount to be included in

19 foundation program for each district.

21 (m) In determining the amount to be included in the

22 foundation program for each district, the state

23 superintendent shall:

1 (v) Based upon ADM computations and identified school configurations within each district pursuant to 2 paragraph (iv) of this subsection, compute the foundation 3 program amount for each district as prescribed by the 4 5 education resource block grant model adopted by the Wyoming legislature as defined under W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xiv), as 6 contained within the spreadsheets and accompanying reports 7 referenced under W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xvii), on file with the 8 9 secretary of state and maintained by the state superintendent pursuant to W.S. 21-2-202(e). The following 10 11 criteria shall be used by the state superintendent in the administration of the education resource block grant model: 12

(C) Salaries for all school and district level staffing categories, including teachers, principals and assistant principals, central office administrators, secretarial and clerical staff, operations and maintenance staff and aides and media technicians, shall be based upon average statewide salary levels calibrated for school year 2005-2006 for each staffing category, adjusted under subsection (o) of this section, including the experience, education and responsibility level as appropriate and as computed for each staffing category. The statewide average for each staffing category shall be adjusted for each

district based upon the district experience, education and 1 responsibility level relative to the statewide average for 2 3 that category. District experience, education responsibility level by appropriate staffing category shall 4 5 be updated each year such that district adjustments reflect the prior school year staffing information. 6 The district adjusted average salary for each staffing category shall be 7 further adjusted for regional cost differences as measured 8 9 by the greater of the hedonic wage index or the Wyoming cost-of-living index computed by the division of economic 10 11 analysis, department of administration and information, with a minimum of one hundred (100) index value, 12 13 prescribed by the education resource block grant model. For 14 purposes of the education resource block grant model:7

16 The version of the Wyoming cost-17 of-living index used by the division of economic analysis shall be based upon the unrecalibrated housing cost index 18 weights unless otherwise determined by the legislature 19 20 based upon recommendation of the joint education interim 21 committee. In addition, the version of the Wyoming cost-22 of-living index applied under this subparagraph for any school year shall be the average of the six (6) consecutive 23

1 semi-annual index reports completed by January 1 of the 2 immediately preceding school year; and 3 (II)The autoregressive random effects 4 5 hedonic wage index shall be used in the computations of the regional cost adjustment, as defined by the August 2011 6 hedonic wage index report on file with the legislative 7 service office and recommended by consultants to the 8 9 legislature, updated annually to reflect changes in student demographic data, the Wyoming cost-of-living index and the 10 11 comparative wage index. 12 13 (vi) Except for charter schools established 14 under W.S. 21-3-301 through 21-3-314, any alteration of the configuration of grades within a district, school or school 15 facility which differs from the configuration of grades 16 17 during the immediately preceding school year as reported under paragraph (iv) of this subsection shall be considered 18 19 a reconfiguration and shall be documented by the district and reported to the state superintendent and the director 20 of the school facilities department. Following review and 21 22 evaluation, the state superintendent and the director shall, each acting independently, approve or deny the 23 24 reconfiguration for purposes of application to the

1 education resource block grant model and the determination of school facility needs and remedies. The following shall 2 3 apply: 4 5 (A) Approval under this paragraph shall be based upon the appropriate delivery of the required 6 7 educational program, the cost effectiveness of the proposed grade reconfiguration for delivery of adequate educational 8 9 services to students with block grant resources, district wide capacity of school educational facilities as defined 10 under W.S. 21-15-109(a)(ii) and any extraordinary 11 circumstances related to the safe and efficient delivery of 12 13 the education program to students; 14 15 (B) Approval under this paragraph shall be required prior to receiving state funds for adding any new 16 17 school within a district; 18 19 Effective for the (C) school year commencing after July 1, 2012, and each school year 20 21 thereafter, no reconfiguration of grades within any 22 district, school or facility shall differ from the previous 23 school year such that more than one (1) school is included

within any one (1) school facility to be reported under

24

1 paragraph (iv) of this subsection for purposes of

2 determining the foundation program amount for that

3 district;

5 (D) As used in this paragraph,

6 "configuration" means the approved combination of grades

7 served within a district, school or school facility as

8 reported for purposes of determining the foundation program

9 amount for that district under this section.

(o) To the extent specifically provided within the school foundation program budget as enacted by the legislature, and between periods of model recalibration required under subsection (t) of this section, the amount computed for each district under subsection (m) of this section shall be adjusted to provide for the effects of inflation, excluding those amounts specified subparagraphs (m)(v)(E) and (F) of this section and the assessment component contained in paragraph (b) (xxviii) of "Attachment A" as referenced in W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xvii). The adjustment under this subsection shall not be applied until the expiration of the school year immediately following the first school year of application of the recalibrated model, and shall be adjusted on a cumulative

1 basis each school year thereafter and until the first

2 school year of application of a subsequent model

3 recalibration. Following analysis of information reported

4 under subsection (u) of this section, the joint

5 appropriations interim committee shall submit a

6 recommendation to the legislature and the governor not

7 later than November 1 of each applicable year on an

8 external cost adjustment for purposes of this subsection.

The director is the chief administrative officer 13 14 of the department with general supervision and control of all activities, functions and employees of the department, 15 under the direction and supervision of the commission. He 16 17 shall devote his entire time to the performance supervision of the duties conferred on him 18 by the 19 commission and by law. The director shall also review and 20 evaluate school district requests for the alteration of 21 grade configurations pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(m)(vi), and 22 shall evaluate the request in the best financial and

educational interests of the state, taking into

18 unexpended, unobligated amounts appropriated to the
