## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; creating the crime

8 Section 1. W.S. 6-2-701 is created to read:

11 ASSISTING SUICIDE

13 6-2-701. Assisting suicide.

14

15 (a) A person who has knowledge that another person

16 intends to commit or attempt to commit suicide and who does

1 either of the following with the intention of enabling or

2 facilitating the suicide commits the offense of assisting

3 suicide:

5 (i) Provides the physical means by which the

6 other person attempts or commits suicide;

7

8 (ii) Participates in a physical act by which the

9 other person attempts to commit or commits suicide.

11 (b) Assisting suicide is a felony punishable by

12 imprisonment in the penitentiary for not more than twenty

13 (20) years.

15 (c) This section does not apply to:

16

17 (i) A licensed health care provider who

18 administers, prescribes or dispenses medications or

19 procedures to relieve a person's pain or discomfort, even

20 if the medication or procedure may hasten or increase the

21 risk of death, unless the medications or procedures are

22 intended to cause death;

1 (ii) The withholding or withdrawing of medical treatment or life-prolonging procedures by a licensed 2 3 health care provider, pursuant to but not limited to a 4 cardiopulmonary resuscitation directive authorized under 5 W.S. 35-22-201 through 35-22-208, a psychiatric advance directive authorized under W.S. 35-22-301 through 35-22-308 6 or an advanced health care directive authorized under W.S. 7 35-22-401 though 35-22-416, but not including the 8 9 withdrawal of artificial nutrition and hydration; 10 11 (iii) Participation in the execution of a person sentenced by a court to death. 12 13 **Section 2.** W.S. 35-22-402(a)(ix)(C), 35-22-410(a)(i) 14 and 35-22-414(c) are amended to read: 15 16

9 A health care provider or institution acting in good faith and in accordance with generally accepted health 10 11 care standards applicable to the health care provider or institution is not subject to civil or criminal liability 12 13 or to discipline for:

15 (i) Complying with a health care decision of a person apparently having authority to make a health care 16 17 decision for a patient, including a decision to withhold or withdraw health care but not including the withholding or 18 withdrawal of artificial nutrition and hydration; 19
