## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; prohibiting the 2 employment of unauthorized aliens as specified; specifying penalties; and providing for an effective date. 3 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 Section 1. W.S. 6-7-201 is created to read: 8 9 ARTICLE 2 10 UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS 11 12 6-7-201. Employment of unauthorized aliens 13 prohibited. 14

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1 (a) No person shall employ or otherwise contract for 2 services with a person who: 3 4 (i) Is or becomes unlawfully present in the United States in violation of federal law; or 5 6 7 (ii) Is not or becomes not lawfully authorized 8 to work in the United States in violation of federal law. 9 10 (b) A person who violates subsection (a) of this 11 section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of: 12 (i) One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for a first 13 offense under this section; 14 15 16 (ii) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for a 17 second or subsequent offense under this section. 18 19 (c) For purposes of this section: 20 (i) The prohibition of subsection (a) of this 21 section shall not apply to any employed or contracted 22 23 person who has an appropriate visa or other work

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1 authorization to be present and work in the United States that is valid and current; 2 3 4 (ii) Any employer who employs or contracts for services with workers who are or were lawfully present but 5 who are acting in accordance with federal law to renew or 6 7 continue their lawful status shall not be subject to the 8 prohibition in subsection (a) of this section; 9 10 (iii) Each person who is employed, contracted with or continued to be employed in violation under 11 subsection (a) of this section shall constitute a separate 12 13 offense. 14 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2025. 15 16 17 (END)

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
