1	AN ACT relating to career-technical education; establishing
2	a merit career-technical education student scholarship
3	endowment fund and an expenditure account; providing
4	funding for future scholarships; providing for a committee
5	to study and prepare plans for implementation of a career-
6	technical education student scholarship program; providing
7	an appropriation and for redistribution of federal coal
8	lease bonus revenues; and providing for effective dates.

10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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12	Section 1. W.S. 21-16-1701 is created to read:
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14	ARTICLE 17
15	MERIT CAREER-TECHNICAL EDUCATION STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP
16	ACCOUNT

1 21-16-1701. Merit career-technical education student

2 scholarship expenditure account created; use of funds.

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4 The merit career-technical education student scholarship

5 expenditure account is created to consist of earnings from

6 the career-technical education student scholarship

7 endowment fund established under W.S. 9-4-204(u)(iii) and

8 such other funds appropriated by the legislature to the

9 expenditure account. Monies within the expenditure account

10 shall be continuously appropriated to the state treasurer

11 for distribution as prescribed by law.

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13 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-4-204(u) by creating a new

14 paragraph (viii), 9-4-601(b)(i)(intro), (iv)(intro) and by

15 creating a new paragraph (vi) and 21-16-1201 by creating a

16 new subsection (e) are amended to read:

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18 9-4-204. Funds established; use thereof.

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20 (u) Other funds defined as follows shall be

21 classified by the state auditor pursuant to subsections (s)

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22 and (t) of this section:

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1	(viii) Merit career-technical education student
2	scholarship endowment fund - to consist of funds
3	appropriated or designated to the fund by law, or by gift
4	from whatever source. In accordance with Wyoming
5	Constitution, Article 15, Section 20, monies within the
6	fund shall not be expended and may be invested in the same
7	manner as other permanent funds of the state. Earnings from
8	investment of monies within the fund shall be distributed
9	and expended as provided by law.
10	
11	9-4-601. Distribution and use; funds, accounts,
12	cities and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments.
13	
14	(b) The state treasurer shall ascertain and withhold
15	all bonus payments received from the federal government
16	attributable to coal, oil shale or geothermal leases of
17	federal land within Wyoming and shall distribute it as
18	follows:

20	(i) Except as provided by paragraph (vi) of this
21	<pre>subsection, f ifty percent (50%), the first seven million</pre>
22	five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) of which
23	shall be distributed as follows, and any amount in excess
24	of seven million five hundred thousand dollars

1 (\$7,500,000.00) per year shall be deposited into the school 2 capital construction account established under W.S. 3 21-15-111(a)(i): 4 5 (iv) And except as provided by paragraph (vi) of 6 this subsection: 7 (vi) Effective July 1, 2014, and until such time 8 9 one hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$125,000,000.00) has been ascertained and withheld under 10 this paragraph, and notwithstanding paragraphs (i) and (iv) 11 of this subsection, one hundred percent (100%) of the first 12 13 one hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$125,000,000.00) 14 shall be deposited into the merit career-technical education student scholarship endowment fund established 15 under W.S. 9-4-204(u)(viii). Thereafter, all amounts in 16 17 excess of one hundred twenty-five million (\$125,000,000.00) ascertained and withheld under this 18 paragraph shall be distributed in accordance 19 with paragraphs (i) and (iv) of this subsection. 20 21 21-16-1201. Excellence in higher education endowment 22 fund; Hathaway student scholarship endowment fund; merit 23 career-technical education student scholarship endowment 24

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1 fund; distributions by state treasurer; legislative 2 restrictions.

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(e) In addition to the endowment funds established 4 5 under subsections (a) and (b) of this section, the merit career-technical education student scholarship endowment 6 fund is established as provided in W.S. 9-4-204(u)(viii). 7 Commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, 8 9 earnings from the merit career-technical education student 10 scholarship endowment fund established under this 11 subsection shall be transferred by the state treasurer to the merit career-technical education student scholarship 12

expenditure account created by W.S. 21-16-1701.

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15 Section 3.

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17 (a) There is created a committee on merit career18 technical education scholarships to consist of two (2)
19 members of the Wyoming house of representatives, appointed
20 by the speaker of the house, and two (2) members of the
21 Wyoming senate, appointed by the president of the senate,
22 together with the following members appointed by the
23 governor:

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(i) One representative of 1 (1) community 2 colleges; 3 4 (ii) One (1) representative of private career-5 technical education institutions operating in Wyoming; 6 7 (iii) Two (2) representatives from business and industry; 8 9 10 (iv) One (1) representative of the public at-11 large; 12 13 (v) One (1) representative from the Wyoming K-12 career-technical education community; 14 15 (vi) One (1) representative from the Wyoming 16 department of education career-technical education program; 17 18 19 (vii) One (1) member of the state board of 20 education. 21 The committee shall study the establishment of a 22 (b) career-technical 23 student merit education scholarship program to be funded by the earnings from the merit career-24

1 technical education student scholarship account created by

2 this act. The goal of the committee shall be to make

3 recommendations to the Wyoming legislature for future

4 legislation necessary for a student merit career-technical

5 education scholarship program to make career-technical

6 education postsecondary programs in Wyoming as free as

7 possible to Wyoming high school graduates. The committee

8 shall consider and make recommendations as to the

9 following:

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11 (i) The amount of tuition, fees and other

12 education related payments which can be sustained from

13 anticipated earnings from the merit career-technical

14 education student scholarship account;

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16 (ii) Career-technical institutions to be

17 eligible for student scholarships awarded under this act,

18 including public and private institutions, with

19 consideration given to any constitutional limitations

20 governing the expenditure of public funds for scholarship

21 purposes;

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23 (iii) Scholarship qualification requirements and

24 requirements to maintain a scholarship including

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1	consideration of high school course completion
2	requirements, performance levels on high school assessments
3	and postsecondary entry examinations, and academic progress
4	requirements for scholarship eligibility maintenance;
5	
6	(iv) Reentry requirements for students failing
7	to maintain eligibility requirements of postsecondary
8	institutions;
9	
10	(v) Waiver provisions, if any, regarding any of
11	the entry or continuing scholarship requirements;
12	
13	(vi) Administrative oversight of the program;
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15	(vii) An implementation date for the program;
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17	(viii) Additional funding for the program.
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19	(c) In addition to subsection (b) of this section,
20	the recommendation of the committee shall include a
21	requirement that the department of education collect such
22	information from school districts, Wyoming community

colleges and technical schools operating in this state, as

24 determined necessary by the department of workforce

1 services to evaluate the impacts of the scholarship program 2 created under this act on state employment and wages. 3 evaluation by the department of workforce services shall be 4 based upon studied control groups of program participants 5 and nonparticipants and shall be reported annually to the appropriations education 6 ioint and joint interim committees, identifying program participants and student 7 control groups. The report shall also identify the return 8 9 on investment of the scholarship program, improve student 10 career counseling and incorporate representative employer 11 assessment of the skills competency of program and control participants. 12

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14 (d) The committee may retain consultants as necessary to fulfill its duties under this act. The committee shall 15 be staffed by the legislative service office. 16 17 agencies shall provide information to the committee as requested in order to fulfill its duties. The legislative 18 members of the committee shall receive compensation, per 19 20 and travel expenses in the manner and 21 prescribed by W.S. 28-5-101. Committee members who are not 22 legislators and are not state employees shall receive the mileage paid members 23 per diem and of the

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1 legislature under W.S. 28-5-101 for each day of actual

2 committee meetings and travel to those meetings.

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- 4 (e) The committee shall report its initial findings
- 5 and recommendations to the governor, the joint
- 6 appropriations and joint education interim committees by
- 7 November 1, 2014.

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9 (f) This section is repealed March 31, 2015.

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- 11 Section 4. There is appropriated from the general
- 12 fund to the legislative service office fifty thousand
- 13 dollars (\$50,000.00) or as much thereof as is necessary to
- 14 fund the merit career-technical education student
- 15 scholarship committee in carrying out its duties under this
- 16 act. Prior to making any distribution to the merit career-
- 17 technical education student scholarship endowment fund
- 18 account pursuant to W.S. 9-4-601(b)(vi) as created by
- 19 section 2 of this act, the state treasurer shall first
- 20 deposit to the general fund fifty thousand dollars
- 21 (\$50,000.00) from those funds as repayment of this
- 22 appropriation.

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24 Section 5.

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2 (a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this 3 section, this act is effective July 1, 2014.

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(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, sections 3 and 4 of this act are effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
