

## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0192

School finance-ELL programs.

Sponsored by: Representative(s) Gingery and Petroff

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to school finance; establishing  
2 supplemental financial assistance for schools serving large  
3 concentrations of students with limited english  
4 proficiency; delegating duties to the department of  
5 education; granting rulemaking authority; providing an  
6 appropriation; and providing for effective dates.

8 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

9

10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-13-336 is created to read:

11

12 **21-13-336. Supplemental financial assistance for**  
13 **schools serving students identified with limited English**  
14 **proficiency.**

15

16 (a) Supplemental financial assistance for programs  
17 addressing the needs of children identified with limited

1 proficiency in English is established to augment resources  
2 within the education resource block grant model for  
3 programs serving at-risk student populations. Supplemental  
4 assistance under this section shall be for school districts  
5 with schools located in the district which serve  
6 significantly large concentrations of children identified  
7 with limited proficiency in English.

8  
9 (b) Each school district with at least one (1) school  
10 located within the district having a concentration of ten  
11 percent (10%) or greater of identified student populations  
12 with limited English proficiency, as computed in the school  
13 year immediately preceding the date of application, may  
14 apply to the department of education for financial  
15 assistance under this section. Application shall be  
16 submitted by the district to the department on or before  
17 April 15 of the school year immediately preceding the  
18 school year for which financial assistance is requested,  
19 documenting those schools within the district having  
20 concentrated populations required under this section and  
21 including a plan for expenditure of grant amounts for  
22 teachers certified to provide instruction in programs  
23 serving the identified limited English proficient student  
24 population.

2 (c) The department shall notify each district of its  
3 eligibility to participate in the financial assistance  
4 program on or before May 1 of the school year preceding the  
5 school year for which application is made, together with  
6 any estimated amount to be made available to the district  
7 for the applicable school year. The department shall  
8 distribute assistance to each eligible district on or  
9 before August 15 of the applicable school year for which  
10 assistance is requested.

11

12 (d) Financial assistance under this section shall be  
13 based upon prior year school level attendance and  
14 configuration reports submitted by each eligible school  
15 district pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(m)(iv). Grant amounts  
16 shall be computed by the department for the eligible  
17 applicant district as if the education resource block grant  
18 model contained the following component for ELL (English  
19 language learner) students in addition to the component  
20 amount resourced for ELL students within the block grant  
21 model, prorated up and down from the specified FTE position  
22 level similar to computational operation of other  
23 components within the block grant model:

1           (ii) One (1) FTE position for every one hundred  
2 (100) ELL students;

3

4           (ii) "FTE" as used in this section shall be as  
5 defined in ATTACHMENT "A" pursuant to W.S.  
6 21-13-101(a)(xvii).

7

8           (e) Financial assistance to each qualifying applicant  
9 school district shall be made by the department from  
10 amounts appropriated by the legislature to the foundation  
11 program account for purposes of the program established by  
12 this section and shall be in addition to the foundation  
13 program amount computed for that district under W.S.  
14 21-13-309(p). If there is an insufficient amount within  
15 the foundation program account from amounts appropriated by  
16 the legislature for financial assistance under this section  
17 for any school year, the department shall make a pro rata  
18 reduction in financial assistance payments among all  
19 qualifying districts for that school year. District  
20 expenditures of amounts distributed under this section  
21 shall be solely for teachers certified in instruction for  
22 programs serving limited English proficient student  
23 populations as identified in the application submitted by  
24 the district under subsection (b) of this section. The

1 department may withhold a portion or the entire amount to  
2 be distributed to any district under this section for  
3 noncompliance with program documentation required to be  
4 submitted by the applicant district.

5

6 (f) Prior to June 30 of the school year for which a  
7 grant is awarded under this section, each recipient  
8 district shall report to the department of education on  
9 expenditures of amounts distributed under this section  
10 together with additional information required by the  
11 department. The department shall compile the information  
12 reported by recipient districts and submit the compilation  
13 to the joint education interim committee.

14

15 **Section 2.** For the period commencing July 1, 2011,  
16 and ending June 30, 2012, one million one hundred thousand  
17 dollars (\$1,100,000.00) is appropriated from the school  
18 foundation program account to the department of education  
19 for supplemental assistance established under W.S.  
20 21-13-336, as created by section 1 of this act.

21

22 **Section 3.** The department of education shall  
23 promulgate rules and regulations in sufficient time to

1 implement W.S. 21-13-336(b) and (c) as created by section 1  
2 of this act for school year 2011-2012.

4 **Section 4.**

6 (a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this  
7 section, this act is effective July 1, 2011.

8

9 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section,  
10 section 3 of this act is effective immediately upon  
11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
13 Constitution.
